Student Materials Fee

In 2016 the student materials and requisites fee is \$85 per child. The ICT charge is \$40 per student or \$100 a family of 3 or more. These are compulsory payments that ensure that your children have the best possible resources. These amounts are due for payment before the end of Term 1 at the Office.

School Council has also set a voluntary levy of \$30 per family to maintain and improve our grounds.

Student absences during February

It is important for the school to have accurate information regarding student absences. Absences that are 'unexplained' can reduce funding that the school receives as part of the February Census. If students have significant unexplained absences during February then they can be taken off the funding schedule. I would remind parents to either contact Deanne in the office or to inform their class teacher if their child has been absent. A note to the class teacher upon the child's return will be acceptable also.

Prep non-attendance days for February

Prep students are not required at school on Wednesdays for the first 6 weeks. They will commence full weeks after the Labour Day Holiday on Tuesday March 14^{th.} The prep teachers will be conducting the prep assessments during these days and parents will be notified when they are required to bring their child to school for their child's assessment. The assessments help the teachers with starting points for the children and this helps inform their teaching.

Staffing Update

This year Ms FitzGerald will be working as our Maths Specialist across the school. This is a DET initiative across the state. She will work closely with 3 other cluster schools to improve numeracy outcomes for all our students.

Mr Mayes has joined our staff as our music teacher and will also be teaching with Ms Fitz in Grade 5/6. Mrs Fitzpatrick will be returning to school and teaching Wednesday and Thursday afternoons for Mrs Tuohey in Grade 1/2T.

Ms Pentreath has re-joined us and will support students in the infant area in literacy for 15 hours per week. Miss Tobin and Mr Watcher will be supporting teachers in the 3/4 grades.

<u>Code Red Days – Bushfire at Risk Schools</u>

Schools, kindergartens and licensed child care centres that have been identified as being at high fire risk and on the Department's <u>Bushfire At-Risk Register</u> will close on days declared Code Red. **Epsom Primary** School has been included on the Bushfire At-Risk Register as therefore will be closed on Code Red declared days. Schools and services not on the Department's Bushfire At-Risk Register will remain open, unless directly threatened by fire or another emergency. Where possible, up to 3-days notice of a planned closure will be provided; parents and carers should, however, expect that in some instances fewer than 3-days notice may be provided. Once the final decision to close is confirmed at 12 noon the day prior, this decision will not change – regardless of any changes in the weather forecast. This will help limit confusion and help your family plan for how your children will be cared for when their school, kindergarten or child care centre is closed.

Advice will be provided to you directly by the school.

When a school or children's service is closed for bushfire, no staff will remain on site and all out-of-school care programs (including vacation, before and after school programs) will not operate.

Student Accident Insurance & Ambulance Cover

Parents are strongly encouraged to have up-to-date ambulance cover as parents are responsible for any medical expenses such as ambulance costs incurred if their child is injured or requires an ambulance at school, or whilst participating in a school activity.

Parents are liable for all medical expenses incurred as a result of student injury. Parents are advised that a number of companies provide insurance for accidents to children that occur whilst they are at school if they wish to have cover for their child or children.

Victorian Government School Term Dates for 2016

- Term 1: 28th January (school teachers start) to 24th March *
- Term 2: 11th April to 24th June**
- Term 3: 11th July to 16th September
- Term 4: 3rd October to 20th December
- * The first day of Term 1 was a student-free day in all government schools to allow for appropriate planning to take place for the arrival of students.

Each year government schools are provided with four student-free days for professional development, school planning and administration, curriculum development,

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and student assessment and reporting purposes. The remaining three student-free days are determined by each individual school and these will be communicated to the school community in a timely manner.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is: \$125 for primary school students/ \$225 for secondary students.

Open letter from King family

Dear Parents

Our son Harry King has a severe allergy (anaphylaxis) to peanuts and is allergic to several other types of nuts.

Anaphylaxis is a severe, rapidly progressive allergic reaction that is potentially life threatening. Harry has to have an `Epipen' with him at all times in case he is exposed to nuts or products containing nuts. An `Epipen' is a single dose injection of adrenaline for administration in an emergency.

Harry's allergy is not just if he eats nuts or products containing nuts. He also can, and has, reacted to touch exposure. Because of this, our concern is the potential for Harry to become exposed to nuts at school from all children not necessarily just children in his grade. For example If he touches a ball a grade 6 child was playing with who has eaten nuts very recently, he could potentially have an anaphylactic reaction.

Nut products include such things as peanut butter, muesli bars, chocolate bars, biscuits, and cakes containing nuts.

From our point of view we would like to see all nuts banned from the school.

We are asking all parents to support us in making the school nut free so we can be sure our son will return home to us each day from school. It's NOT a case of, if Harry becomes in contact with nuts he could get an itch or a rash, he COULD DIE.

Your help in this would be greatly appreciated.
