


## Mandarin in the Museum

 山 (Shaan) Mountain

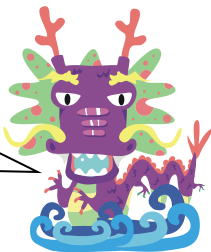
 大 (Dah) Big
