



BREAKING NEWS—GSPCA New Build Begins



The GSPCA is proud to announce the start of the first phase of its Rebuild and Redevelopment Plan.

With over 140 years of helping animals in Guernsey and being based at our current location since 1929, the GSPCA provides around the clock care and rescue at the Animal Shelter in St. Andrews.

The Shelter has had many developments over the years moving with the times to help the varied species that come through the door. Some of the structures date back to the 1950s and are becoming difficult to run and maintain. The team at the GSPCA and its Managing Committee have been working hard planning for the future.



The new welfare building will help provide a safe

haven for animals like Spot, a tiny kitten found all on his own with no mother in sight only a few weeks ago near Admiral Park. The young kitten was found terrified and full of worms and fleas, but with the care of the staff at the GSPCA he will soon be in a loving new home.

The new building will comprise of a two storey structure that will have multi-purpose use including welfare cattery, quarantine, isolation, animal reception, laundry, electrical substation and more.

It is without doubt the biggest project we have undertaken at the GSPCA. It is an essential but costly undertaking and to go hand in hand with this project we are launching our exclusive Build Partner programme.

What is the objective of the GSPCA Build Partner programme?

The Build Partner programme is designed to meet the building costs associated with our new £1.3 million multi-purpose animal welfare building. The building is to replace five existing structures that have become unusable with age.

Seasonal Advice— What to do if you see an injured seal



Every Autumn the shores of the Bailiwick see Grey Seal pups being born and the GSPCA are issuing advice today on what to do especially with the rough weather that is due.

If anyone see's a pup with or without a mum we really do appreciate a call so that we are aware of its location and condition but here is some advice.

A healthy pup looks like a big, stuffed maggot without a neck. However, a thin pup looks sleek (but not bony) and has a visible neck, like a healthy dog.

PLEASE DO NOT TOUCH THE SEAL. They can give a nasty bite, which will become infected by bacteria that live in a seal's mouths.

Note: Do not allow dogs or other animals to harass a seal.

If a Seal is scared back into the water, it could then be washed out to sea by strong currents and be lost. You should **not** put a seal pup back in the sea as it may get into difficulty.

If a Seal pup is sick, thin or injured then we would ask you to contact the GSPCA immediately on 01481

257261 day or night

When reporting an injured, sick or abandoned seal to the GSPCA, please make sure you are able to supply the following information:

- Exact location; nearest town / village
- Position on the beach, and state of the tide
- How long you have observed the pup; any disturbance / risk to it; whether the mother has been seen
- Any wounds / obvious signs of illness
- Length/colour/condition.

Caution:- Handling of any animal either domestic, wild, dead or alive may be potentially hazardous. Obvious dangers include bites, scratches and general hygiene issues. Common sense should be applied in all instances and, if unsure, seek additional advice or assistance. Personal hygiene should be taken into consideration after handling any animal, whether it's domestic, wild, dead or alive.

Seasonal Advice

As well as cold, wet weather, winter bring long dark nights. Now the clocks have changed, many of us will

be getting home from work after dark and walking our dogs at night. When driving, it can ben very hard to see people and animals on the sides of the road. As owners, we are aware of high vis jacket and waistcoats we should be using, but what about our dogs?

ing horses in wet weather.

Despite being domesticated for over 6000 years in the wild, horses are well adapted to cope with cold and can withstand temperatures below zero. However, there are a number of things that you can do to maximize your horse's health during the colder months:

- Has your field got natural or adequate shelter and space? In muddy conditions it is important that horses have an adequately sized, welldrained area in the pasture on which to stand, lie down and feed.
- Does your horse have company or enough of your time?
- Have you got a supply of extra feed for the cold months?
- Are you registered with a local vet and farrier?
- Do you know what your donkeys, ponies or horses normal behaviour and health is?

If you are cannot devote more time to your horse's care during the winter months, consider keeping your horse at full livery, where there is adequate winter turnout and a high standard of daily care.

Animals at Christmas



At this time of year we receive a lot of calls regard- Short days add to the complication of winter care. Make your first visit to your horse each day as early in the morning as you can. If there is a problem, you can call for assistance in daylight.

> There are a huge variety of different rugs and rain sheets on the market to suit all types of donkeys, horses and ponies. It is best to ensure you use the right rug for your needs.

> If you plan to ride in winter, beware of getting your horse sweated up in the afternoon, as horses can easily catch a chill. Also ensure that you and your horse have appropriate clothing to ensure that you are able to clearly be seen.

> Make arrangements with an experienced person to take care of your horse in the event of an emergency, for example if you are ill or cut off by bad weather. A starting place could be one of the local groups or clubs who will have a network of experienced owners.

> More than anything you MUST remember that your horse needs you. At the GSPCA we are concerned about the animals out when we have awful weather but we do sympathise with the owners.

Animal Castle Day



Earlier this year the GSPCA were invited by Guernsey Museums and Galleries to attend their 'Animal Castel Day' at Castle Cornet.

On the 6th October we invaded the castle! There were rabbits, guinea pigs, tortoise, donkeys and a parrot for children to watch and stroke. There was also a large educational side to the day, with talks on 'Famous animals in history', 'Guernsey gulls' and 'Bats!'. Workshops on the day included a dog training demonstration and a chance for children to have a go making environmental enrichment toys for the rabbits and guinea pigs! To make these toys we used cardboard boxes and toilet roll tubes. These were then stuffed with hay and vegetables. Children who had rabbits at home took then home for their pets and we hope it will encourage people to think of easy ways to enrich their pets life.

Children were also entertained by dressing up and by face painter, Joni Lockwood. We owe a huge thank you to Joni, who has supported us at various event this year.

The day was a huge success, helped by the lovely weather despite it being late in the year. We raised £841 to help look after animals in Guernsey.



Learning with the GSPCA



Throughout the year, the GSPCA run various educational courses and events. These are aimed at anyone with an interested in animals, regardless of whether you have pets at home.

A popular course has been our Animal Care and Welfare Course, which is run in conjunction with WEA.

The course covers:

- Wild animal rescue and first aid,
- Emergency care,
- Domestic animal health checking,
- Animal handling and grooming,
- Animal behaviour and psychology,
- Nutrition and diets for animals,
- An introduction to the GSPCA and the history of animal welfare,
- and an Introduction to careers with animals

The course is run over eight evenings and costs £60 (2014 price).

The course tutor is Steve Byrne, GSPCA Manager, who has over 17 years experience managing We are also holding Pet Bereavement Training. RSPCA animal shelters. Steve has wealth of experience from owning a large variety of his own pets, volunteering and working in a number of other animal environments, experience in working with International groups in animal care and has been with the GSPCA for over two years.





The GSPCA also runs regular Cat and Dog First Aid These courses are run over one day courses. (lasting approximately 3 hours) and we ask for a minimum of £15 donation.

During the sessions you get the chance to learn about what to do if you were faced with an emergency situation with a dog or cat. The course covers bandaging, heatstroke and CPR, among other subjects. All participants receive hand-outs, a few goodies and surprises. We have had great feed back from the first aid courses we run in 2014.

These evenings are taken by staff from Guernsey Bereavement Service. The sessions are aimed at helping those who are in a position of informing public that their pets have sadly died. The sessions have prooved very successful and we are looking to run another in April.

L'Ancresse Pond—Warning to dog owners



There has been a potential poisoning of a dog around the Millennium stone area on L'Ancresse Common. It is thought a dog may have suffered an adverse skin reaction after paddling in a pond near the stone. The Environment Department, Heath and Safety Executive and the States Veterinary Officer took the claims very serious and currently investigated the area. The results from the pond came back clean. Possible causes of the injuries include blue-green algal blooms, hairs from the nests and caterpillars of the Brown Tail Moth which are known to have been in this area, 'Alabama Rot' and Occupation white phosphorus mortar bombs. We are advising dog owners to be particularly vigilant when and after walking their dogs.

Help find Bertie



On Saturday 8th November a 7 year old grey Schnauzer called Bertie was scared by bonfire displays and escaped from his back garden, near the Vale Primary School. The GSPCA are helping coordinate the search for Bertie and have a working map with sightings, locations, dates and times.

Bertie is a very nervous dog, especially around men and people he doesn't know. If you do spot him then please call the GSPCA on **01481 257261**. Please do not approach or try to catch him as it is likely to scare him away and will not help with his safe capture. If you do try to approach him he is likely to take off. If he is in a secure area where you can close a gate or door then please do so and call the Shelter.

All reports of time, location and direction of movement are extremely important, pictures or video clips also help. We are in close contact with Bertie's owners. They have put up a £200 reward for his return.

Firework Calendar Launch



Bonfire night is a very worrying time for many pet owners in Guernsey, especially with the increase in firework displays taking place in the week surrounding the 5th November. The GSPCA has launched a new calendar to inform local pet owners when firework displays are happening. The GSPCA's Animal Welfare Manager, Lorna Prince, is on the Firework Committee in Guernsey and backs the initiative. The GSPCA see an increase in stray and escaped animals during the firework season. We hope that this new calendar will help owner prepare and keep their pets safe, especially for those owners who have very nervous pets. At the GSPCA we also sell 'Adaptil' and 'Feliway' products, which can help reduce stress in animals.

Pasha is 3 1/2 year old neutered male rabbit. He has lived as a house rabbit and is very friendly (as well as being quite cute!)



Pusskins (12 years) may look like a bit of a grumpy cat, but don't let this fool you! Pusskins loves nothing more that having her head and cheeks rubbed! She was a little nervous when she first came in and would benefit from a quiet home.





We currently have ferrets at the shelter and on foster, all looking for a home. Ferrets are very trainable animals and can make wonderful pets. They have been used in many films and can be clicker trained, just like dogs! Ferrets will also sleep for roughly 18 hours a day! We have some lovely ferrets who would make a lovely pet for first time owners, as well as those needing owners with a little more experience and knowledge.





Rosie and Jim (the cockatiels) and Rose (the budgie) are currently living in our aviary and can be seen in the car park of the shelter. Since moving them out of the bird cages, they have become more active and more vocal. Now that their welfare has been improved by giving them the ability to exhibit normal behaviours, we are looking to rehome these birds to an aviary.






Mitch is a Meyers Parrot. Meyers parrots are generally quite quiet parrots. They can learn a few words, as well as whistles and other noises. Generally, they will bond with everyone in a family. We do have birds arriving fairly regularly. Please call us if you are interested in one. Where possible, we aim to rehome all birds to aviaries or free flying environments. We will be able to advise you on the different species we have and the needs (e.g. exercise and companionship needs) of each individual bird.

We have more animals available and other arriving all the time. Please visit our website or call the shelter if you are interested in any of them, or would like to arrange a visit.

Taking on any animal is a big responsibility. They require care, attention, time and love. We urge everyone to seriously consider whether they can provide for an animal and avoid impulse buying.

Wildlife—Blue



This beautiful bird is Blue, a Northern Gannet. Blue is under a year old and is most likely one of this years chicks from Les Etacs or Ortac off Alderney. It will take Blue roughly three years to change to his adult plumage of a white body with black wing tips and a beautiful yellow head.


Although the birds breed of Alderney, it is very common for us to see the gannets in Guernsey waters. Gannets travel huge distances to hunt. Some birds will travel to the South Coast of England, others northern Normandy and some to the south of Jersey (see map below). A gannet can typically travel 200km in 24 hours! Gannets


feed by diving for fish from heights of 10—40meters! The have specially adapted skulls, which contain fluid filled sacs, and no external nostrils, to help absorb the shock and prevent injury of hitting the water at 100mph!

Poor Blue was found at Grande Rocque and was incredibly weak. He was gasping for breath and it was very easy to catch him. Blue was taken to the vets, who saw that he had a severe throat infection. This would have impacted his ability to fish. Blue was put in a course of antibiotics and a painkiller. He needed to be hand fed and was given vitamins along with his fish. As Blue became stronger, he was put out onto the seal unit pond to rehabilitate. Over the last month we have seen Blue become a different bird. He has now been ringed and is trying to take of on the pond. This is a great sign and shows he is ready for release.

Gannets spend the winter of the west coast of Europe and can travel as far south as Africa! We will be releasing blue on the north of Guernsey. We hope that he will join up with other gannets travelling south and be shown the wintering sites. Gannets do not spend along time away from the Channel Islands and will start returning in January. One reason for this is the high competition for limited nest sites. Some gannets have been known to guard their nest sites for 11 months of the year! With 11,000 birds nesting

together, space is in short supply! If you are around the coast and spot a gannet, it is worth watching them for a few moments and you make be lucky enough to see one of their spectacular dives!

Turtle and terrapin warning



Films, TV and social media can have a massive impact on the type of animals people get as pets. A University of Bristol study, published last month in the journal 'PLOS ONE', analysed 87 movies featuring dogs and found that the release of movies is typically associated with an increase in the popularity of featured breeds. The authors warned that because the most popular breeds also have the greatest number of inherited disorders, this trend spelled bad news for dogs. With the release of the new Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles movie, the GSPCA is urging parents not to rush out and buy turtles

and terrapins for their children, but carefully consider this purchase first. Turtles are not cheap pets to own. The average lifespan of an aquatic turtle is 25 years, but they can live for up to 50. The costs of vet bills, a thermostatically controlled enclosure, lighting, food, habitat enrichment and cleaning during this time can total tens of thousands of pounds over their life span. The other consideration is that 3/4 of all pet reptiles die within their first year in a home. If you are thinking of adopting any pet it should be thought through, researched and the whole household should understand the responsibilities.



Why Ferrets make great pets

The GSPCA still has many ferrets looking for homes. We have ferrets suitable for first time owners, who are friendly and enjoy handling, to those that are a little wilder and would benefit from owners with a little more experience. If you are interested in coming to meet our ferrets, or would just like some more information on their needs, please give us a call at the shelter (01481 257261). Here is a little reminder of the background information on the fantastic ferret that was published in our GSPCA Magazine:

- The average lifespan of a ferret is 6 years, but they can live to 10.
- A healthy ferret will sleep between 18-20 hours a day!
- Ferrets have bad eye sight but brilliant senses of taste, smell and hearing.
- Domestic ferrets are sociable animals and most enjoy living in groups.
- Ferrets are intelligent and need mental and physical stimulation they will play constantly during the hours they are awake.
- Ferrets can catch the human cold, so you do need to be careful about hygiene if you are ill.
- Ferrets have been trained for films using clicker training; a method also used to train dogs, owners can easily teach their pets tricks! They can also be trained to use a litter tray.
- Ferrets have been domesticated for around 2000 years.
- Ferrets are incredibly flexible and have been used to run cables through small spaces, ferrets were used to rig the cables at Buckingham Palace for Prince Charles and Princess Diana's wedding!

The ferrets that we rehome from the GSPCA will have been neutered (if male), health checked and undergone a behavioural assessment.

We spend time getting to know all the animals that are up for adoption, so we can ensure that we are placing them in the perfect home for them.
