

RAIL TRAVEL HIGHLIGHTS OF NEW ZEALAND'S SOUTH ISLAND Friday 19 March to Tuesday 30 March 2010

This 12-day tour will depart Sydney on Friday 19 March 2010 to Christchurch. The proposed tour will visit the Ferrymead Heritage Park, Christchurch's heritage trams and Weka Pass Railway before setting off around the South Island, with travel aboard the famous TranzAlpine, TranzCoastal and Taieri

Gorge Railway. Other planned destinations include Shantytown (near Greymouth), the Plains Railway (Ashburton), the historic remains of the Denniston Incline, Wanaka and the west coast glaciers. From the South Island, we will cross to Wellington via the Interislander ferry. While in the New Zealand capital, the tour will take in the Silver Stream Railway and Wellington Tramway Museum before returning to Sydney on Tuesday 30 March. Breakfasts,

POWER HOUSE MUSEUM REPOSITORY DISCOVERY TOUR


Friday 30 April 2010
