

Let me hit the highlights of the annual meeting in case you were unable to attend on January 27th.If you were a half hour late, you would have missed it anyway, as we set a new record for "git 'er done" I am grateful that God provided funds to finish 2012 "in the black", even with some expensive projects such as a new roof on the youth center this past year.

The church approved the following men to serve on the Board for a two year term: Ed Bradley, Jack Coats. Myron Matz, Curt Reynolds, Paul Theriault, and Chad Overbeek. Chad replaces Verlin Thompson who decided to step down after many faithful years of service. Please make sure you give an "attaboy" to Verlin for all his time and wisdom in serving. He isn't going anywhere, but felt it was just time to step aside for someone else. These gentlemen join Leland Hershey, Lynn Groff, Gil Redmer, Jeff Bradford, Travis Cooper and yours truly on the Board. Curt and Leland attend primarily the East Jordan campus. Our budget that was approved for this year was just over \$1,000,000. Some of the new equipment we need to replace includes some of the projection items, and computers seem to have a shorter and shorter shelf life, so a regular replacement schedule keeps the eventual crashes from causing chaos. We also need to replace the main copy machine on the Walloon campus. Next year we will have to look hard at a vehicle, so if you know of an opportunity in the transportation arena, please let us know, as those tend to be pretty big ticket items. Both vans currently have significantly over 6 figures in miles travelled.

We now have 13 employees on staff, with **Dorothy Prins**, our new full time Children's Ministry director the latest addition. As with most organizations, the cost of health care is a significant concern, and the Board chose to cap the funds we will allocate to purchase insurance, so please continue to pray for our continued wisdom and discernment as to how to best take care of those who serve as their vocation, while at the same time being good stewards of the widow's mites that are entrusted to us each Sunday.

The high, as usual, was Easter Sunday at 972 for Walloon alone. The low was March 4th: NOBODY, except maybe Pastor Bob telling anyone that drove up that we had no power! That snowy Sunday gave me a chance to get over to East Jordan that day though since I didn't have any teaching responsibilities! It all works out in God's economy.

I am so thankful to be part of a community of believers striving to make a difference for the Kingdom of God in northern Michigan. As we also remain missions/world minded as well. I mean this very sincerely:*Thanks* for letting me serve.

Children's Ministry Memos He's Always Here to Pick Me Up! • Dorothy Prins, WLCC Children's Ministry

Have you ever fallen? I have! I'm the type of girl that when it's icy out I'm gonna fall. I guess I should be *really* honest and say that ice does not have to be present for me to fall at all. For me, falling is a fact of life. I remember falling in eleventh grade when I hit a patch of ice and ending up under a parked car...so glad it wasn't moving! I remember walking out of a store, slipping in slush and having to return to work completely soaked down my left side. I remember cheerfully chasing after my, then, eight year old son on a warm June day, rounding a corner into the side yard, falling, and wondering "What just happened?" I remember walking across a parking lot, stepping onto a snowcovered curb, slipping and trying to figure out what was clinking on the drive behind me only to realize it was my glasses that were knocked off from the impact. And I remember walking up to the front of our packed church on Christmas Eve to read from His Holy Book, tripping and hearing the gasp of the entire congregation.

Those were all literal falls. And with each of these falls, I've always gotten back up, brushed myself off and carried on toward my goal. But what about falling short of the plans God has for me or commitments I've made? I'm am the first to admit that I am far from perfect and I have fallen in so many many ways. But each time I fall, I cling to the hope and grace that I have in Jesus. In Proverbs 24:16 it is written for though a righteous man falls seven times, he rises again, but the wicked are brought down by calamity. As a parent, I am frequently reminded that God uses my weakness to demonstrate His strength and grace. And rather than dwelling in my falls, I've learned from my mistakes, grown from them, and told myself "next time I'm going to do it different." That's what life is all about.

Gisela Yohannan, author of Broken for a Purpose, writes that God wants for the world (and our children) to see how true Christians humble themselves, confess their sins, love one another, ask for forgiveness, love their enemies, persevere under trials, exercise faith, trust the Lord in difficult circumstances and are faithful until death. He looks for faithfulness and sincerity in the testimony we have for Him before the world. So each fall I have in life, I know God sees it as an opportunity and He's just waiting for me to turn to Him. Psalm 37:24 says "though he stumble, he will not fall, for the LORD upholds him with his hand." I've learned that I need to see my falls as opportunities to rise again and show the world, particularly my children, the peace that comes from receiving his grace and knowing that He has overcome the world.

The most influential thing we can do for children, whether or not we are their parent, is to continue to point them to our Heavenly Father and pray, pray and pray some more.

Here are three prayers I encourage you to pray over your kids each day:

- Pray they would be caught when they make wrong choices.
- Pray God would lead them from the wrong friends and to the right friends.
- Pray they grow to be to be Godly people in their sphere of influence.

In My Own Words A Lesson And A Celebration •Susan Miller

One of the benefits of living in northern Michigan is the ability to get out and experience God's creation during a variety of seasons. While it seemed a long time in coming, the weekend before Christmas there was finally enough snow to strap on my new set of snowshoes, take off through wooded trails, feel the gentle "poof" of the snow's cushion, and simply stop and hear the silence. One of the challenges, though, was that the snowfall had started out particularly wet and heavy, resulting in many small trees bending right over and obscuring the normal pathway, plus the trail markings on the trees were obliterated by snow that had stuck. This required frequent re-routing of my path, as well as ducking to avoid a snow "shower" down my neck. All part of the adventure, right?

After a few hours, I arrived back at my car ready to exchange damp outerwear for dry, and head home for a hot shower and a bowl of steaming chili. Only one problem: No car keys! I searched through every possible pocket, but to no avail. I should have listened to that "little voice" that told me to zip the keys in my pants pocket, but I had decided that was too much trouble, and instead had put them in my jacket pocket (which I apparently forgot to zip!). Thanks to my cell phone and a friend willing to give me a ride home to get my spare set of keys. I was able to be on my way. However, I discovered that a replacement set of keys was going to be a significant \$\$ investment (thanks to the "technology" of a little theft-prevention "chip" inside the key). A few days later a friend and I retraced my steps, but did not see any sign of the keys.

Fast-forward 3 weeks. Though there was still quite a bit of snow around, we'd had some days of warmer temperatures. I was heading north of town to go trailwalking, when that "little voice" nudged me to go look for those keys one more time. So I turned around and went back. After all, what did I have to lose? I started the search. By this time my original tracks were all but gone. Prayers of "God, lead me, open my eyes".... To the south of the road, no keys. Up the trail to the north...and...*I found my car keys!* Celebrated with a spontaneous praise moment: "GOD, You're awesome!!!!" Celebrated by texting the friend who had helped me search. Celebrated by speaking His name and about His leading to those whose paths I crossed in subsequent days. What an amazing God we have!

God still would be awesome and amazing even if I had not found my keys, but the experience itself has taught me several lessons. The most obvious lesson is an up-close and personal example of the parables Jesus told about the lost coin, the lost sheep, and the lost son (and, by interpretation, US) in the gospel of Luke. I now know from experience what the celebration feels like when one FINDS something that seemed to be hopelessly lost. A more significant lesson to me, though, would be the importance of hearing and heeding the "still small voice". Had I done so, and put the keys in my pants pocket in the first place, I would not have had to go through this situation. Had I NOT done so, I would not have gone back to search the second time, would not have found the keys, and would have missed out on the chance to celebrate and testify to God's awesomeness. How many times does the Holy Spirit nudge me to go somewhere, say something or send a note, and I ignore the prompt? What discomfort do I go through or celebration do I miss because my mind is too distracted, or because heeding the voice is "too much trouble"? Other lessons worthy of mentioning include the lesson of gratitude for a network of friends and acquaintances willing to interrupt their day to come to my "rescue", and the reminder that when God shows up in some amazing way, we have the responsibility to share that with others. To God be the GLORY!
