DEACON NIEL'S CORNER:

In today's gospel from Luke, words we hear are not warm, a comforting blanket or protective bubble to wrap ourselves in as we go through life. This gospel is not easy rather it is challenging and demanding and, in its call for personal conversion, it can also be considered divisive and confrontational, putting us and those we love on opposing sides. In our lifetime, how many times have we heard family disputes and maybe even in our own personal lives have experienced today's gospel.

To be a disciple of Christ is not to be without cost. If we are to live today's gospel faithfully, we must become a contradiction to those around us requiring us to embrace a more ethical and moral standing in today's life challenges. The gospel not only calls us to serve God but demands that we risk power, prestige and even acceptance to stand up for equality, justice and compassion for those less fortunate than us.

Jesus tells us that if we are to live the gospel faithfully, His words challenges us to grow beyond our fears and our narrow-mindedness.

Jesus demands more courage, more compassion and humility that we believe that we are even capable of regardless of the costs or consequences.



In addition to the weekly classes, weekends at the Seminary in Huntington enrich the PFI process. Two to three formation weekends and/ or workshops are held each year. After completion of the two year program, participants have an option to enroll in a variety of ministerial leadership courses of their choosing.
