Reflection

19th SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

"Everyone who believes in Me shall have eternal life"

1st reading (1 Kings 19:4-8)

Gospel (John 6:41-51)

DEACON NIEL'S CORNER:

In today's first reading from the Book of Kings, we hear that the prophet Elijah gives up and says to God "Lord I have had enough". He is broken in spirit on his journey to the wilderness - he has reached the end of his rope. An angel comes and feeds him with miraculous food -- a hearth cake and a jug of water and hope is restored by this "bread from Heaven" so that he can continue his journey to the holy mountain Horeb and in doing so, he sees God in a new light. Courage and faith are restored to face the challenges of other days to come.

Many times in our own lifetime we can feel what Elijah has felt and want to say "Lord I have had enough". Christian life is by no means "clear sailing" and we sometimes find ourselves become disheartened by circumstances that come our way. We need the assurance that we are not alone and that God helps to carry "our crosses" and rescue us.

Today's gospel points out that we have such a help in Jesus who is the "bread of life". He brings to each of us just what we need to sustain us on our journey to God. Jesus is the "heavenly bread" -- He is the medicine for our sick souls -- He is the nourishment for our wounded spirit -- the light and strength for our weary minds -- He is the source of eternal life whose presence strengthens us -- He is the living bread which has come down from Heaven and our source for everlasting life.

When we receive the Eucharist, we meet a God of love who has forgiven us and asks us to give as freely as we receive. We are not to hold grudges, or lose our temper or raise our voices against each other or call each other bad names or to be spiteful. Instead we are to be friends to one another, to be kind, be forgiving and be loving to each other. And when things in our life don't go our way, it is then that we may know how great is the faith that has been given to us.

Let Us Pray Holy Father in Heaven, guide us in our journey of life and help us to walk on the pathway of Your Son Jesus who is the "bread of life" and we ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

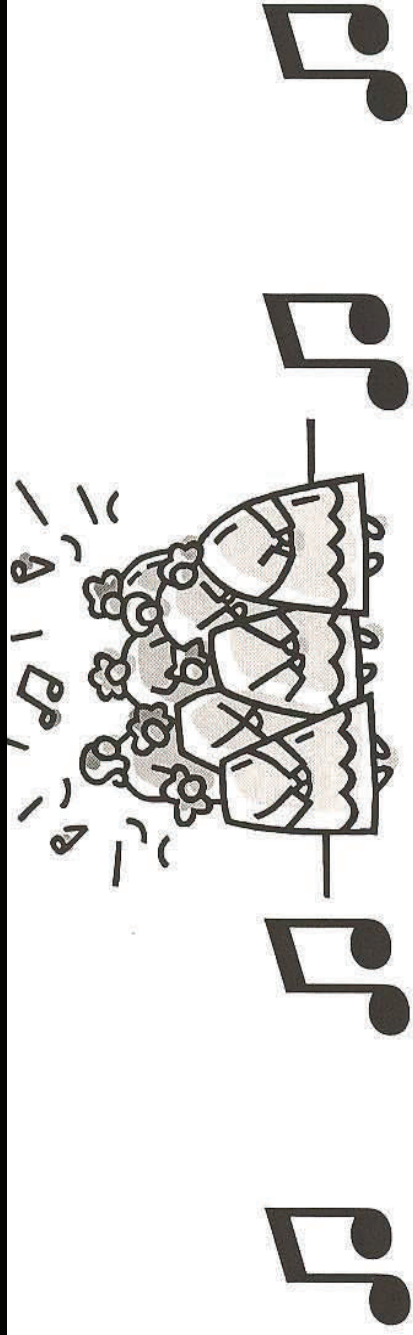

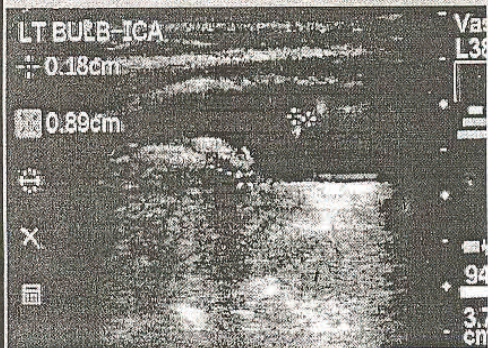
