
The Pharisee Within

Today's Readings: 1 Samuel 16:1b, 6–7, 10–13a; Psalm 23:1–3a, 3b–4, 5, 6, (1); Ephesians 5:8–14; John 9:1–41. It is easy to criticize the Pharisees in the story of the man born blind. They are quick to pounce on the most trivial offense, and then completely overlook a jaw-dropping miracle. To them, violation of the Sabbath is so evil that tremendous good cannot compensate. They condemn easily, calling Jesus a sinner and threatening the blind man's parents with expulsion from the synagogue. They persist in an inquisition and revile a man whose only crime is being cured, and talking about it. Their endless debates and futile efforts to control grace are dispiriting and divisive.

The tricky part is identifying the Pharisee within ourselves. Sometimes we too cling to the past, the safe routines that prevent the entrance of grace. We defend our comfort zones, lest mystery penetrate them and confuse us. We're afraid of the ways compassion and love might lead us—we'd prefer to be isolated, sure we've got the right answers.

Today's Gospel shows how surprising the way to enlightenment can be. The blind man is hardly a wisdom figure. In fact, he's confused by Jesus' title "son of man." But he progresses from a faith dependent on his parents to a touching, personal testimony to Jesus, who cured him. He seems a simple, direct person, and his words accord with that: "Lord, I believe" (9:38)—nothing pious, flowery, or posed.

For John's community, the ultimate goal is mystical union with Jesus. The formerly blind man is a sure guide to follow in that direction.



On the fourth Sunday of Lent the Church presents Jesus healing the blind man. In keeping with the themes of the "Scrutinies" (Jesus triumphing over sin and death with new life and light) the gospel reading introduces someone who was not only healed of his physical blindness but someone who was healed from his spiritual blindness as well. Recognizing Jesus' healing power and love the blind man is moved to proclaim "Lord I believe!" Like the people of today's gospel, our elect and all of us need to answer Jesus question, "why do you persist in your blindness, insisting that you can see?" We are moved from darkness to light, blindness to sight, by the radiant light of Christ's glory and truth. Wednesday, March 21 The Son's Gift of Life

Today's Readings: Isaiah 49:8–15; Psalm 145:8–9, 13cd–14, 17–18 (8a); John 5:17–30.

In today's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the marvelous life shared between Father and Son, which he later invites his followers to join (see John 17). His assurance that the Father and he are still working (5:17) gives courage to endure even bleak times. To those who suffer or mourn, who feel lifeless or disappointed, Jesus promises: "The Son gives life to whomever he wishes" (5:21).

Thursday, March 22 The Testimony of Good Works

Today's Readings: Exodus 32:7–14; Psalm 106:19–20, 21–22, 23 (4a); John 5:31–47.

Jesus' works, according to today's Gospel, testified on his behalf (5:32). Can we say that for ourselves? Have we been faithful to prayer, almsgiving, fasting, and service? If we're feeling proud of our accomplishments, Jesus asks, "How can you believe when you accept glory from one another and do not seek the glory that comes from the one who alone is God?" (5:44).

Friday, March 23 Saint Turibius de Mogrovejo

Today's Readings: Wisdom 2:1a, 12–22; Psalm 34:17–18, 19–20, 21 and 23 (19a); John 7:1–2, 10, 25–30.

This Spanish saint, whose optional memorial we may celebrate today, served as Bishop of Lima, Peru, from 1581 until his death in 1606. Upon arrival, the new Bishop did not act as the Spanish overlords expected. He traveled the country, on mule or foot, and spoke out against the terrible oppression of Peruvians by Spaniards. His diocese was huge, and he traversed it three times, learning native dialects, uncovering abuse, and founding hospitals, schools, and churches. Division among peoples and opposition from authorities are themes also found in today's Gospel.

Saturday, March 24 Voice of the Voiceless

Today's Readings: Jeremiah 11:18–20; Psalm 7:2–3, 9bc–10, 11–12 (2a); John 7:40–53.

When he was appointed Archbishop of San Salvador, Oscar Romero (1917–1980) was regarded as a conservative who wouldn't cause disturbance. The murder of his friend, Jesuit Rutilio Grande, however, was a turning point. Romero's weekly radio broadcasts fiercely opposed a violent military regime and made him the voice for the voiceless poor. Just as in John's account of Jesus, some thought him a prophet; others wanted to arrest him. Romero was assassinated while saying Mass, and was mourned by the poor he defended.

This Week at Home

Monday, March 19 Solemnity of Saint Joseph

Today's Readings: 2 Samuel 7:4–5a, 12–14a, 16; Psalm 89:2–3, 4–5, 27 and 29 (37); Romans 4:13, 16–18, 22; Matthew 1:16, 18–21, 24a or Luke 2:41–51a.

As we celebrate this great saint, Matthew shows us Joseph's distress at the prospect of condemning Mary to public shame because of her pregnancy. Inspired by a dream, he rises beyond the constraints of the law. Luke depicts Joseph's terrible ordeal of losing the child Jesus in the temple. To honor Saint Joseph, many people of Italian and sometimes Polish backgrounds today host "Saint Joseph's table," a feast for the poor.

Tuesday, March 20 First Day of Spring

Today's Readings: Ezekiel 47:1–9, 12; Psalm 46:2–3, 5–6, 8–9 (8); John 5:1–16.

The vernal equinox marks the time when day and night are equal: each 12 hours. After today, days will be longer. In today's Gospel, Jesus offers life and hope to the man who waited 38 years for a cure. He begins by asking, "Do you want to be made well?" (5:6). The answer seems obvious, but sometimes there is a payoff in remaining an invalid or dependent. Ask yourself Jesus' question.
