Yearbook Deadlines for Seniors

- ⇒ Seniors will be asked to sell ads to local businesses to help defray the cost of yearbooks. Any senior interested in selling ads should see Mrs. Lacaire for the information and paperwork that needs to be completed beginning on Tuesday, September 8, 2015. All ads need to be completed and returned to Mrs. Lacaire, as soon as they are received by the student. The last day to turn in ads and money is Friday, November 13, 2015. Any senior selling at least \$300.00 in business ads will not be required to pay for their copy of the yearbook. Seniors not selling ads will be asked to cover the cost of their yearbook (approximately \$45.00). This payment needs to be received by Monday, December 21, 2015, in order to reserve a copy of the yearbook for seniors.
- ⇒ Seniors are asked to submit one (1) baby picture for the yearbook. Baby pictures will be accepted until Monday, December 7, 2015.
- ⇒ Seniors are asked to submit one (1) candid picture for the write-up section of the yearbook. Candid pictures will be accepted until Monday, December 7, 2015.
- ⇒ Seniors are asked to submit one (1) color senior picture for the Senior Portrait section of the yearbook. Pictures may be submitted on photo quality paper, digitally on CD, or by email. Digital images are preferred; however, they must meet the following specifications: 2 x 3 size in 300 dpi. Senior pictures will be accepted until Monday, December 7, 2015.
- ⇒ Senior will be asked to complete a write-up for the candid section of the yearbook. Write-ups will be distributed after Christmas vacation and will be accepted until Friday, January 15, 2016.
- * Please make sure that your name is on the back of any picture submitted (and it is labeled for use in the correct section), so that it may be returned to you after the yearbook staff has scanned it. Quality of yearbook pictures is dependent on the original picture. (Blurry images will remain blurry.)
- * Digital images are accepted and encouraged, since the yearbook will be completed using an online program. Pictures taken digitally should be from a camera with at least 4 mega pixels. This requirement allows for better quality pictures in the yearbook.
