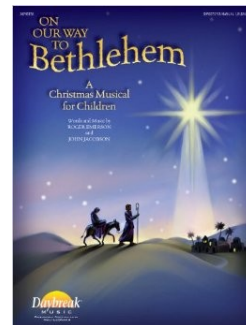

## WE WELCOME MATT GRIEPENTROG AS OUR NEW YOUTH DIRECTOR!

When **Matt Griepentrog** (“GREE-pen-trog) begins his shared position as Youth Director at Cross of Life and Christ the King in December, he will come armed with a wealth of experience overseeing a church’s Youth program. As well as its Sunday School program. And Confirmation. And Vacation Bible School. For the past seven years, as the Director of Christian Education and Youth at South Shore Trinity Lutheran Church in White Bear Lake, Minn., Matt was responsible for *all* of those areas.

While he enjoyed the experiences, he’s excited to focus his efforts on one area – Youth & Young Adults, which includes Senior High – when he joins us. Matt will divide his time between our two congregations: 3/4 at Cross of Life and 1/4 at Christ the King.

Matt is also looking forward to returning home to family and friends. Raised in Milwaukee, Matt graduated from Milwaukee Lutheran High School. He moved to St. Paul, Minn., to attend Concordia University, where he took courses in the Director of Christian Education Program and majored in Parish Administration. He graduated from Concordia in May 2007 and joined South Shore Trinity Lutheran Church that fall.

The person he’s most happy to come home to, however, is his wife Joy, who took a teaching position this fall at Lake Country Lutheran School in Hartland. He and Joy will live in Pewaukee for the time being and will be close to his parents, grandparents, a sister, and many friends, all who live in the Lake Country area.

“I’m excited to be closer to family and friends, but I’m also excited to get to know the people in the new congregations,” Matt said. “I had a really enjoyable time meeting the staff, as well as some of the youth and parents, at both churches. I’m looking forward to being involved in the Youth program, building relationships, and being a part of all the fun stuff. I was watching some of the videos online and you can *tell* they have a lot of fun! Both churches seem like very friendly places with very welcoming people.”

During his free time Matt enjoys golfing, running, playing board games, watching movies, and spending time with family and friends. “I also love the Packers!” he is quick to add. Not the Vikings? Nope. According to Matt, “There’s no persuasive argument to be made there whatsoever.”

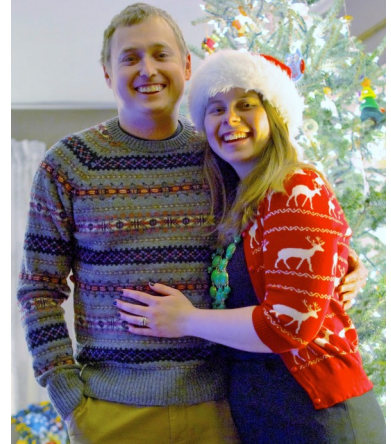
Even away from work he likes to spend time with teens. “I enjoy going to different events the youth are involved in, whether it’s a sporting event, a play, whatever. To me, no matter how busy you are, you have to try to make that work. It’s great for the youth to know you’re supporting what they’re doing, and I go because I *want* to be there.”

For Matt, building relationships is very gratifying. “Because I’ve been at South Shore for seven years, I’ve been able to see a lot of the youth begin in the program and work their way from middle school through high school and into college. I’ve been able to see the people they’ve become. Watching each one of them grow in their faith and as a person is very rewarding.”

While he admits it will be sad to leave his position at South Shore, he’s had time to process it. Joy announced to the congregation in April that she would be taking her new position in the fall, so everyone knew Matt would join her. “We’ve made some really good friends in St. Paul so it will be hard not to see them, but now we’ll be with friends and family in Wisconsin, so Joy and I are happy about that.”

Matt and Joy met at Concordia University while they were serving on Student Senate and have been married since June 2010. Matt is excited for Joy to have found a great teaching job and was happy to support her decision to move here. After all, she does some pretty great things for him, too. “I turned the big 3-0 in January,” Matt says. “Joy threw a surprise party for me in the theme of the TV series *Mad Men* and everyone dressed in character. Now *that* was really cool!”

Matt appreciates the opportunity to serve at Cross of Life and Christ the King, and looks forward to having a positive impact on our kids’ faith journeys. “I want the youth to know what Jesus has done for them and how he has shown us to live ... and how we can share his love and grace with everyone in our lives.”



# COLLABORATION UPDATES & OPPORTUNITIES

## PREACHING ROTATION IN PLACE FOR DECEMBER

An ongoing preaching rotation is now in place between Cross of Life and Christ the King. John, Sherrie, or Muriel will each preach once a quarter at CTK and Jim from CTK will preach at COL two times in each three-month period. ## UPDATE: HEALTH & WELLNESS CENTER

In the November newsletter we reported on the work of the group formed to utilize the \$25,000 grant from the Siebert Lutheran Foundation. The grant was extended to our two congregations to study the possibility of exterior grounds improvements and new construction at the Christ the King site.

These projects would create a variety of health and wellness features. Exterior projects might range from community gardens, ropes courses, contemplation areas (like a labyrinth) to athletic and play areas. Indoor features would include spaces like a kitchen for cooking groups, space to support the free clinics we work with, and a gym that could host both sports activities and overnight groups serving in the Milwaukee area.

The group is rapidly completing its task in connection with Zimmerman Architectural Studios. They will share site maps, possible building options, and tentative costs to the congregation at special Sunday Adult Forums in January 2015.

The basic areas of consideration will be things like the following:

- Looking at a master plan for the site that could guide a series of improvements over a period of several years.
- Comparison of the costs and benefits of renovating existing CTK space and/or constructing new space.
- Examination of wetlands and environmental corridors on the property and possible location of exterior features.
- Consideration of needed updates to the existing building including roof repair and fire sprinkler system.

Looking at these possibilities is independent from the conversation about our overall relationship as congregations. We were fortunate to receive the Siebert grant and we will want to evaluate the Health and Wellness options carefully, realizing that the collaboration between the congregations might be enhanced by a project like this but also is not dependent on it.
