



COME JOIN THE CIRCLE: Unit 2 - Mary & Elizabeth's First Christmas

MARY'S SONG

Read the Song: Luke 1:46-55

Reflect on the Song:

Mary is young and became pregnant before her marriage. She is described as anawim - a Hebrew word meaning "those who are marginalized and excluded." Yet she is chosen by God to give birth to the long promised Messiah. What happens to her is a sign that God's way is not like the world's way. In God's reign, the proud are scattered, the lowly are lifted up, the hungry are filled, and the rich sent away empty.

Many people in our world – perhaps you yourself – walk a rough road. They know what it is to feel lowly and hungry. What witness comes to us from those who have been excluded and are on the margins? Think of ways you can work with others to demonstrate God's commitment to justice, both in your community and around the world.

Sing the Song. Talk about the Bible story children and youth explored this week and try this:

- 1) Check your hymnal for settings of Mary's Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55).
- 2) Make it a practice to be at worship each Sunday and to participate in the special services your church offers.
- 3) Set up a crèche or nativity scene if you have one. Talk about the different characters in the story. Wonder what Mary and Joseph did to get ready for the coming of their new baby.
- 4) Write or call someone who, like Mary, has spoken up for justice.


