Cst. Manon MacKenzie reviewed the RCMP report for March 2013. She noted that the majority of the property crimes were thefts from vehicles. She encouraged residents to lock their vehicles as these were crimes of opportunity She reported that there were several school walk-throughs. They complete a minimum of one patrol per month per school. Cst. MacKenize reported there were seven vehicle check stops performed. The RCMP hope to have bicycle patrols again this year.
