Hairy Woman's Stile at Grafham



Grafham Cricket Club

There is no easy way to say it; Grafham were bowled out for 10, when playing the Bedford Hospital Wanderers. In mitigation; the Wanderers batted first and were bowled out for 161 by Grafham. There seemed no terrors in the pitch to herald Grafham's batting performance, just good bowling, and poor bats- The last game to report before this article goes for publimanship. As it has been said in a previous "Gossip" article; Grafham's batting this season is either golden or leaden; this performance was of the basest lead.

Next week Grafham faced the Bedford Lions, in some ways a tense affair, with Grafham having to provide the match ball, because the home team, who should be the provider of the match ball, left it, "well at home"! Grafham bowled the Lions out for 175, with Chris Brown 10 overs 40 runs for 4 wkts, and Matt Chester 8 overs 46 runs 3 wkts being the main Grafham wicket takers. After the Lions took the early wicket of Colin Grundy for 2, the Lion's bowling met the in-form Chris Brown who scored 88 runs, and the equally in form Gareth Knowles who scored 39, with Tom Chester clubbing a quick 32, saw Grafham home by 5 wkts.

Chris Dighton with 10 overs 59 runs for 4 wkts, with Tom Chester and Adi Love taking 2 wkts apiece. All Grafham's batsman contributed to the all out score of 142, but no one could make that major score in the 60s or 70s that might have won Grafham the match.

cation was against Newnham at Mowsbury Park. Outstanding bowling by Matt Chester 5.2 overs 10runs 4 wkts; with Chris Brown 8 overs 21 runs for 3 wkts reduced Newnham to being all out for 95. Newnham had one batsman who scored 52 runs; otherwise it was the Grafham's bowlers who ruled the day. A steady opening by the Grafham's top 3 batsmen saw Grafham at 51 for 1 against a pacey, but at times wayward Newnham bowling attack. At this stage of the game the steady accumulation of runs promised an easy victory. However this promise changed when the bowling attack turned to spin. In next to no time Grafham were 71 for 6, but a defiant innings of 16 not out by Jamie Smith, supported by Craig Pritchard not out 2 saw Grafham home without further loss; Grafham winning by 4 wkts.



Now don't get us wrong, we like chickens, and eggs even more, but the only purpose of their visit is because 'the grass is greener on the other side'! Having dug up the flower beds, scratched away at the gravel on the drive until it looks positively bald and sat in the flowering tubs as though sunning themselves on a Mediterranean sun lounger they then dutifully return under the fence back home for the night to roost having not left us with a single egg between them; oh well at least the cockerel is now quiet!

I stood in chicken poo today, twice!! Well I suppose that could bring as much good luck as when it falls from the skies above! All in all it has been an eventful and stressful month and we will now wait with baited breath to find out what exhilarating stories August will bring.






