# TASK DETAILS

### 1. Description of the Task

You are asked to conduct an historical investigation and present your findings.

### Step 1

To do this you must

- negotiate a topic for an historical investigation with your teacher
- formulate an appropriate historical question or hypothesis based on the chosen topic.

Possible historical investigations could include:

- a case study
- aspects of a case study
- aspects of the Preliminary core study
- significant individuals or groups
- significant events
- aspects of society
- a thematic study
- historical debates
- historical concepts
- historical sites
- constructions of the modern world by the media.

## Step 2

Once you have formulated your historical question or hypothesis you need to conduct research in order to answer the question.

### This involves:

- planning
- comprehending written sources
- locating, selecting and organising relevant information from a variety of sources
- using a variety of sources including viewpoints of historians
- analysing sources for their usefulness and reliability
- identifying different historical perspectives and interpretations evident in sources
- synthesising information from a range of sources to develop and support an historical argument.

### Step 3

You are asked to present and communicate the findings of your historical investigation in two formats. Present an argument in response to the question that you have formulated in an essay form.

### Part A Your essay (20%)

- should include reference to a variety of sources both written and digital
- should include reference to at least one historian's perspective
- should use historical terms and concepts appropriately
- should include a bibliography and reference list of all resources used following the guidelines outlined in the College Diary
- must not be more than 1200 WORDS in length

Deliver a five (5) minute presentation on an element of your historical investigation. The presentation may include a speech, powerpoint, video, part of a documentary, models, diagrams etc.

# Part B Your presentation (10%)

- should include reference to a variety of sources both written and digital;
- should include reference to at least one historian's perspective;
- should use historical terms and concepts appropriately
- employ a variety of techniques to engage the audience

The essay and a hard copy of your oral presentation must be submitted in the Assessment Bin at the Student Foyer by 9:00 am on Monday  $4^{th}$  of August.
