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Marysville High School has much of which to be proud. Marysville High School was one of the *first three public high schools established in California*. Marysville High School was established in 1871 as a feeder school to the newly formed University of California at Berkeley, which was the first public university constructed west of the Mississippi River in 1868. The *Class of 2015* is Marysville High School's *143*rd *graduating class*. There is no public high school in California with a longer history or tradition than Marysville High School. The graduation ceremony is designed to honor and reflect the quality efforts members of the *Class of 2015* have put forth, along with their parents, the school, the community, and the seven generations that have preceded them. Because of an increasing amount of overcrowding and instances of discourteous behavior by some of those attending the Marysville High School graduation ceremonies in past years, we want a graduation ceremony that is orderly and *respectful* of graduates, their families, the school, and the community.

Toward creating this quality venue, every graduating senior's family will receive ten (10) tickets for the ceremony. No one will be admitted into the football stadium for the Friday, June 5, 2015 ceremony without a ticket. Tickets will be distributed, in the main office, during the last week of May, directly to students or parents only. There will be no replacements for lost or stolen tickets.

Families who need fewer than ten (10) tickets can give leftover tickets to families who need them, or drop them off at the main office, so that unneeded tickets may be redistributed to those who demonstrate need for additional tickets.

Families who need more than ten (10) tickets can contact the main office at (530) 741-6180, ext. 3100, 3101, or 3102, or come by the Marysville High School main office and sign up for additional tickets <u>BEFORE May22nd</u>. Families can receive up to 15 tickets total. Beyond 15 tickets, families can acquire additional tickets from other families who are not using all of their tickets and/or put their name on a waiting list in the main office for recycled (unused tickets that are submitted to the office and then redistributed) tickets. There are no guarantees beyond 15 tickets.

What we all share is a desire for the graduation ceremony to be respectful, classy, enjoyable, and memorable for all involved. Parents, graduates, community, students, and staff have appreciated this process the past several years. I very much appreciate your patience and cooperation with this process.

Spring testing is here!

This year, juniors will be tested on the Common Core standards using the CAASPP (California Assessment Student Performance and Progress) developed by the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium. This test will be electronic and students will be tested in both English Language Arts test and Math. Within each subject matter, there will be a computer adapted test (CAT) lasting approximately 2 hours, a classroom instruction piece lasting ½ hour, and a performance task based on the classroom instruction piece (2 hours for ELA and 1 ½ hours for math).
