Book Reviews

A few years ago, I made a pilgrimage to the Guthrie Valley to witness all of the Degrees of the Rite. I was so impressed with the work, the building, the people, the city, ... and of course, the food (how many BBQ restaurants can one town actually support?), that I affiliated with the Guthrie Valley. I regularly receive their bulletin and am impressed with the quality of the publication, and of the work happening in Guthrie. I look forward to each edition's book review section, with good reason. In the latest copy, there was a book review that caught my eye. Here's the marketing appeal:

There has never been as much controversy in Masonry as that generated by the writings, rituals and symbols of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry and its members. The majority of all Masonic conspiracy theories center upon the arcane symbolism of the Rite. In recent years study guides have become available, but they lack an in-depth and personalized discussion of our ancient mystical tradition. A man might read about the color of our hats, but it is unlikely he would be faced with a spiritual discussion of the colors as they relate to the Craft. The time has come for such a book. The time has come for this book. Kyle Ferlemann provides us with an in-depth, easy to read and understand text book for the Scottish Rite. It is, "The Bridge Builders Guide."

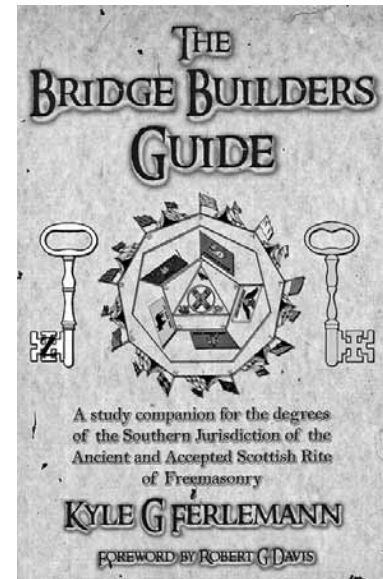
Bridge Builder's Guide by Kyle G. Ferlemann

Available on the web site is a sample chapter. I read it ... then immediately clicked on the *Add to Cart* button. At last, a kindred spirit. A refreshing voice who doesn't attempt to tie the Masons to glories of the past. Here's an excerpt:

The true mission of the Masons:

"This course of instruction has a specific purpose. "The province of Masonry is to teach a path to all forms of truth – moral, political, philosophical, and religious." To create within the free world a host of men who are capable of recognizing and defending freedom from



the myriad aggressors who would see freedom fail in the advancement of their own interests. This is not a modern conspiracy theory; this is a time-tested, and often repeated, lesson of history."

The author continues, "This book does not represent a different or new idea but rather articulates the fullness of the degrees. Everything has been laid down before by wise men for us to discover. This is the articulation of their plan, the explanation of their rational, and the revelation of their true Masonic goal. It is important

that we study with the full knowledge of what we want to accomplish. Masons should not seek random secrets for the promotion of their individual situation but instead seek the fullness of true illumination so that they may better serve their fellow man. The Bridge to Light can be fraught with perils for those who misinterpret the symbols. We are repeatedly warned of this because the lessons are difficult and complex. The Bridge to Light must be built according to plan."

Amazing! If the goal of Masonry *is to educate a host of men who are trained in the philosophies and mechanisms of a free society*, then this book is well timed. If you, as a man and a Mason, hope to stand in defense of well ordered liberty, then this book will help you understand the social and political themes within the Degrees. You'll learn the tools for making a good life. You'll explore the vows that you took in the 32nd Degree. You'll walk through the Camp scene. And, you'll learn about the symbols, shapes, characters, and characters contained within the rich and elaborate Degrees of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite (SJ).

If you consider yourself a serious student at Masonry's University, then this book belongs on your shelf.
