

PART 1 – QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. The Painting contractor shall furnish all labor, materials, tools and equipment necessary for the painting of all specified surfaces.
- B. All work to be done in a workmanlike manner by skilled workers and carried out in such a way to minimize any inconveniences plant operators. The contractor shall maintain a workforce necessary to complete project and shall have a competent person, i.e. foreman/supervisor on the job site.
- C. The Contractor shall be responsible for the clean up involved from work outlined in this specification, and their employees during performance of project on a daily basis.

2. LIASON

- A. The owner's representative and the Painting contractor shall transmit all information pertaining to the job and shall not permit unauthorized interference from plant personnell.
- B. The Painting contractor is required to correct in a timely fashion any work reasonably rejected by the Owner's representative.

3. TERMS & CONDITIONS

A. It is anticipated that the aforementioned work be inclusive and that there will not be extras or changes. The need for extra work and changes in the specs will be the sole responsibility and determination of the owner and will be submitted as a written work order or Change order to the Painting contractor. No extra work will be done as specified without a written work order from the owner.

B. INSURANCE

The Painting Contractor will be required to furnish suitable insurance certificates covering liability and property damage. Worker's compensation coverage and they shall be kept in force during the course of project. The Painting contractor shall hold the owner harmless from all liens or damages arising from or caused by the work.

C. SAFETY RELATED PRECAUTIONS

1. The contractor shall adhere and comply with all Osha Safety Regulations on the job.

PART 2 EXECUTION

ACCESS

A. The Painting contractor must be allowed easy access to the work site.

STAGING AREA

- A. The Painting contractor is to be assigned a staging area. The Owner will make every effort to provide a suitable area. At the end of each working day, all equipment, ladders, supplies must be returned to the staging area and the working area must be left clean. Protection of this area is the sole responsibility of the contractor and shall be left in a clean, safe and acceptable manner.
- B. The contractor shall be responsible for the proper disposal of any waste generated during the course of work.

REPRESENTATIVE

A. Engineer shall represent the owner in all matters pertaining to the work as it progresses. Interference by unauthorized individuals must be controlled so as not to impede the smooth progress of the work. Contractor shall review all work to be accomplished with project representative to avoid misunderstandings.

DIFFERING SITE CONDITIONS/UNFORESEEN CONDITIONS

A. The contractor may encounter field conditions that are different that the contractor or Engineer reasonably believed, or were led to believe, would be encountered. If unforeseen conditions occur, the contractor shall notify the owner of the conditions soon after the condition is encountered to enable owner/management to investigate methods of reducing the cost of dealing with the condition, which may affect cost and schedule impacts of the contractor.

PAYMENTS

- A. The schedule of payments required under the terms of this contract is attached hereto and incorporated herein, as "Exhibit A". Upon completion by contractor of any stage of work requiring payment under this contract, the contractor will provide written notice to the owner/Engineer that such work is completed and that payment therefore shall be due within (10) days of such notifications.
- B. Any objections to work performed shall be given, in writing, to the contractor within five (5) days of the contractor's written Notice to Owner that the work has been completed. If no objections are made within this period, then payment due, as specified in said notice shall be forthwith tendered to contractor.

CONTRACT TIMELY COMPLETION

A. Contractor agrees to commence work when directed by Owner/Engineer and to diligently and continuously perform such work, and to coordinate the work with other work being performed on the project by other trades so that the owner/Engineer shall not be delayed by any act or omission of the contractor in completion of the project within the time specified above.

The first one is the eight (8) light posts in the park located at the basketball courts and Hockey rink. If anyone has been around them you would know that they are completely rusted. I would say somewhat hazardous and certainly not pleasing to look at. These are the large posts used at night and are close to 20 years old. I received three bids that you will be able to peruse.
