PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY Family Staying Fit Together

May is National Physical Fitness and Sports Month. This is a great time to focus on the benefits of getting active. For this article, I want to focus on family fitness. How can family fitness together possibly be achieved? The best way to get fit and spend more time together as a family is to put the two together. This doesn't mean you have to go to the gym together and workout for an hour each day. It probably makes more sense to incorporate activity (exercise) normally into your day.

Besides staying fit, there are other benefits and rewards to family fitness.

Exercising together makes it easier to stay fit. Family activity can help family through stressful times. It can enable families to get closer together.

- This can enable parents to find opportunities to coach children on how to take on a challenges and how to deal with failures.
- Family activity can provide opportunities to enjoy silly moments together.
- *It can be a powerful glue to help hold a family together.

Here are some fun ideas for family fitness together: Make time for play. Set aside 30 minutes to one hour at least three times a week to do fun exercise with your children. Instead of watching TV for your down time, go outside and play ball, tag or other fun game. Be sure to incorporate more walking and bicycling into your day.

Set aside a family "worktime" with every member helping with active housecleaning, washing the windows or gardening. Remember this is exercise too! Consider singing and dancing while you clean.

Plan active family outings each weekend and on the holidays.

Buy sports equipment for birthdays and other gifts times for each family member. Consider buying kites, jump ropes, Frisbees and balls.

Walk and bicycle everywhere you can to such places as grocery store, school, library or sports events. Keep a log everyone's mileage and use a family exercise log or colorful stickers to track everyone's progress. Make your walk or bike ride a friendly competition.

Try a new activity together as a family. Choose a new sport and learn it together.
