In 2008, the Town was given a grant from Senator Dale Volker to complete a preliminary feasibility study regarding the development of renewable energy. The purpose of the Study was to evaluate energy alternatives that could supplement current electric energy sources and reduce costs to the Town. The results indicated that sufficient resources may exist for the development of Wind Energy in the Town of Brant, pending further detailed study and assessment. The next step in the process is to gauge whether sufficient community support exists to justify additional study into assessing the viability of constructing and operating a wind farm in the Town of Brant.

The purpose of this survey is to gather information on public opinion regarding the development of wind energy in the Town.
