We encourage any community members to come check out our facility for hosting events. We have hosted wedding receptions, birthday parties, class reunions, among other events.

At CCC we take great pride in maintaining our golf course. The board of directors has the duty to set policies and procedures to make sure the country club has nice equipment for members and stays on track financially. We have two main employees that run the day to day operations. Kaleb Childers and Jake Smock. Kaleb Childers is our Superintendent. Kaleb just finished his first season at CCC. The course is shaping up to be in the best condition in recent years. Kaleb has done a wonderful job keeping the course in great shape all season as well as staying within his annual budget. In June, Laura fell and broke her wrist; resulting in the wearing of a heavy external fixator for six weeks. Once out of the external fixator, she was unable to move her wrist and was very sensitive to touch. Laura was completely unable to use her R hand/arm for work or activities of daily living.

Over the past couple of months, Laura has worked very hard in occupational therapy to regain motion. She is compliant with her home exercise program and is cooperative during therapy sessions.

At this point, Laura has regained almost full range of motion in her wrist and her strength is coming back as well. She is now able to use her right hand/arm during daily tasks, as well as work tasks. It was been a pleasure to work with Laura and see her progress throughout the rehab process.

For most accurate results, participants should be “fasting” – no food or drink, except water after midnight before blood draw. Results will be provided to participant and their designated provider.

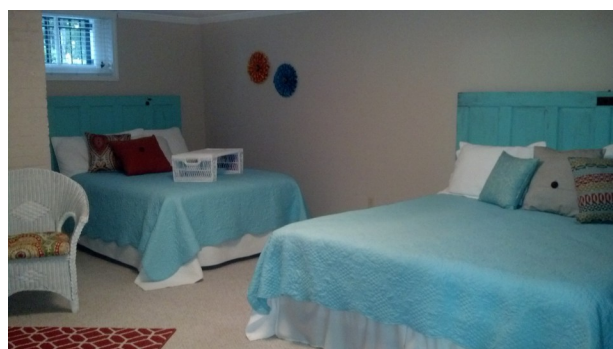

Halloween Fun Planned at Burrell's Woods

On October 23-24 the City of Carmi, in conjunction with the Carmi Chamber of Commerce, will be hosting a Halloween Weekend at Burrell's Woods.

On October 23, those camping will be encouraged to decorate their campsites with a fall theme. "We do ask that the campsites be kept child friendly as we want the children to have a good time and not be afraid of the decorations," noted Chamber Executive Director Holly Healy. The campsites will be judged and a winner of the best decorated campsite will be announced on October 24 at the costume contest and will receive a prize of \$15 Carmi Dollars.

On October 24, a day of fun is planned for families and the community is welcome to attend. At 10:00 a.m. a pumpkin decorating contest will be held at the shelter at the campground. Families are asked to bring their own pumpkins for the event. Age division for the contest will be: 5 and under, 6-12, 13-17 and 18 and up. Those 12 and under will be provided markers to use. Ages 13-17 may use markers or carve a pumpkin, but those carving must be supervised by a parent or guardian. Ages 18 and up must carve their pumpkin. Those wishing to carve a pumpkin should bring their own tools to do so. A prize for the best decorated pumpkin will be awarded for each age group.

At 2:00 p.m. a scavenger hunt will be held for families kicking off from the campground shelter. Families will scour the park searching for items from the clues given on the list provided. The first family to find all items will be awarded a prize. All children 17 and under must be accompanied by an adult.

At 4:00 p.m. a costume contest will be held. Adults and children are encouraged to come dressed in family friendly costumes. "Again, we do not want children to be afraid of the costumes," noted Healy. Prizes for the best costume will be awarded for the following age groups: ages 3 and under, 4-6, 7-9, 10-12, 13-17 and 18 and up. An overall best costume will also be awarded \$15 in Carmi Dollars.

From 5:00 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. trick-or-treating will commence in the campground. Children are welcome to go from camper to camper trick-or-treating. "Please only trick-or-treat campers that have someone sitting in front of them handing out treats. Additionally, this is a time for trick-or-treating at the campground only- not within the City of Carmi," stated Mayor Jeff Pollard.

Camping October 24 and 25 will be by reservation only and all campsites are currently full. Those wishing to be placed on the cancellation list should call the Chamber office at (618) 382-7606.

"We want this to be an enjoyable weekend for families. Bring a picnic lunch and plan to spend the day enjoying Burrell's Woods," noted Pollard.

- The deadline to enter the Corn Day Stars Contest is Friday, October 9th at 12:00pm.
- The Entry Fee for both categories is \$10.00 payable to Carmi Kiwanis Club. Entry Fee must be brought to the WROY/WRUL office/studios (101 N Church) in downtown Carmi by the deadline in order for the contestant to be registered in the contest.
- **12 & under contestants** must check in by 11:30am on Saturday, October 10th at the Main Stage (backstage). The contest will start @ noon. (Under the age of 13 on the date of show 10/10)
- **13 & up contestants** must check in by 11:50am on Saturday, October 10th at the Main Stage (backstage). The contest will start @ noon. (Age 13 and up on the date of show (10/10)
- Only 7 contestants will be allowed in each age division or a max of 10 if one of the age divisions doesn't fill up.
- Music tracks must be supplied with registration (for singing contestants) and will be available for return following the contest. It will be the contestant's responsibility to retrieve their music track after the contest ends.
- Musical instruments and any props needed for the act must be approved.
- Groups are allowed, but will be limited to two microphones.
- Each contestant (singing) will be limited to 2 songs or 8 minutes. Contestants are allowed to sing or perform only one song if they desire.
