Looking for a Bargain?

As spring approaches, the Library Board of Trustees and director Ruth McCrank have the task of preparing the Library's budget for the new fiscal year beginning in May. The good news, of course, is that last year, the average Westchester household only paid \$133.00 in taxes to the Library. All members of the family have access to books, movies, music, Internet, magazines, newspapers, on-line databases, story times, computer classes, library programs, and a knowledgeable staff.

If \$133 sound high, think how quickly a family can spend \$133 in groceries, dry cleaning, and a tank of gas in just one week! Here are other comparisons to consider: 7 winning Grammy albums, at an average cost of \$19 each, will consume \$133 of your entertainment budget; three months of standard cable TV costs \$157; and regular tickets for four to attend one White Sox game can cost anywhere from \$60 to \$140 and that doesn't include refreshments!

Your Library is open 7 days a week during the school year, 6 days a week during the summer, and patrons have 24/7 access to the Library's electronic resources from home, school and the workplace. We take pride in knowing 61% of Westchester residents are registered library cardholders – and we invite the other 39% to stop by the Library to see what they are missing!

Culture Thrives at the Library

For the second year in a row, the Youth Department was awarded the **We the People Bookshelf** grant, a collaboration of the National Endowment for the Humanities and the American Library Association, to encourage young people to read classic books and explore themes in American history, culture and ideas. This year's award consists of 15 books on the theme of "Becoming American" that have been added to the collection and available in the Youth Department.

New books in the Spanish language are now on shelf and available for check out, with more on the way, as part of the Library's *Enlarging the Welcome Mat* grant. Funding for this grant was awarded by the Illinois State Library (ISL), a Division of the Office of Secretary of State, using funds provided by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), under the federal Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA). Author Jeff Libman is coming to share stories from his book AN IMMIGRANT CLASS: Oral Histories from Chicago's Newest Immigrants on Sunday, March 11, and musician Nelson Sosa will help the Library celebrate Día De Los Niños/Día De Los Libros on Sunday, April 29, with a program of Latin American songs for children and families. New READ Posters Announced

The President and Board of Trustees of the Westchester Library are proud to continue the READ poster program started during the 50th Anniversary celebration last year. The READ poster program recognizes individuals or groups from the community for their achievements or assistance with the Library. Library Board President Jennifer Boyle said, " the program is a great success, bringing members of the community in to view the posters and rediscover the library."

This year's posters include: Top Readers from the schools (Westchester Middle School, Divine Infant Jesus and Divine Providence); members of the Westchester Gardens, the Westchester Community Image Council, and the proud winner of the Westchester Gardens design contest who will redesign the garden area in front of the Library.






Friendship Star Quilt for Library in Bayou La Batre

In the aftermath of Katrina, the Library collected donations from the community to help rebuild the children's collection of the Mose Hudson Tapia Public Library in Bayou La Batre, Alabama. Staff members explored other ways to support the patrons and staff of the hurricane-damaged library, and the deliberations resulted in a quilt designed and sewn by Roberta Conrad and Clare Bremer, both passionate quilters in the Youth Department.

The quilt incorporates fabric squares with handwritten messages and signatures by each staff member, and the label on the back reads "Stronger than the winds of Katrina, the Hands of Friendship." The quilt is on display in the adult fiction area and will be sent to the Mose Hudson Tapia Public Library for *their* celebration of National Library Week in April.
