- 1. In addition to the assignment, a bill of sale should be signed by the Assignor or Transferor to the Assignee.
- 2. The bill of sale in the form that follows was used in a mobile home transfer and may be used for an automobile or other personal property items.
- 3. The form contains some language applicable to default which should permit the Assignor to regain possession of the property in the event the Assignment Agreement is breached.
