Alfalfa Quality Contest for Youth

There will be an alfalfa quality contest for youth at the fair on Wednesday, July 22, from 1:00 -5:00 p.m. in the Dairy Arena. The Outagamie County Forage Council is sponsoring this activity for youth ages 9-19. There will be two divisions - juniors 9-13 years old and seniors 14-19 years old. The contest will include 3 parts: 1) a written test, 2) a visual grading on an alfalfa bale and 3) laboratory analysis of the alfalfa. Entrants will submit one small square bale of approximately 40 lbs or 1'-2' slice of large square bale for visual grading and forage analysis. One entry per person. Prizes will be awarded.

- 7. Participants are responsible for fair admission and parking.

County Fair Information

The Outagamie County Fair activity is July 21-26 at the fairgrounds in Seymour. The schedule of fair events is listed at the beginning of this newsletter. Your 4-H club received all final details and instructions at the June 22 leaders meeting.

Please review the rules for each department. Exhibits not following instructions will be lowered a placing or receive a participation ribbon only. The premium book can be found at www.outagamiecountyfair.com

Entry of exhibits to the Outagamie County Fair activity is Wednesday, July 22, 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. All families must abide by this time policy so please mark your 4-H family calendar now.

Individual conference judging allows the members to discuss their exhibit with the judge. There may be a waiting line, but remember the purpose of fair exhibits is the education. Respect the time the judge takes with each member.

Advance Junior Fair Season Passes

Advance Junior Fair Season passes are available for \$4 to junior exhibitors (13-18 years of age) and \$10 for 4-H Leaders (all passes include parking). Passes may be purchased at the UW-Extension Office through Friday, July 17. NO junior fair season passes will be available during the fair.

4-H Dairy Bar

The 4-H Club Dairy Bar will operate July 21-26. Anyone at least 12 years old and over, able to commit to a 4 hour shift, ready to meet new people and have a fun time can volunteer. Taking Orders At the Dairy Bar

We will have the same procedure as in 2014 with cash registers being used. Every customer will order and pay at the cash register from a line that will be roped off. After



ordering the customer will proceed to pick up their filled order and use the condiments.

- Each shift will need 2 cashiers which will be • appointed. They are responsible to take the order and payment from the customer and to give them and the volunteer the receipts needed to fill the order.
- Receipts are for any hot food order, volunteer • copy, and customer copy. Each receipt has an order number that will be called out (instead of a volunteer's name) to complete the order.
- If you have a malt order, you need to fill out a malt slip and hand it in the malt window. Make sure to put your customer receipt order number on the malt slip.
- Please Listen For Your Order Number To Be **Called So You Can Complete The Customer** Order.

Fairgrounds Parking Rules

- 1) Park only in approved areas.
- NO PARKING around buildings allowed from 8:30 a.m. Thursday to 6:00 p.m. Sunday. Access to barns and unloading will be allowed in the mornings until 8:30 a.m. Towing will be enforced by law enforcement officers.
- DO NOT park in front of barricades, maintenance sheds, dumpsters or the manure pit. Fire lanes must be kept clear.
- 4) All livestock trailers must be parked on the west fence line of Henry St. Maximum length will be 24 feet.
- 5) NO 24-hour parking allowed on the fairgrounds unless approved by the fair office.

Penny War at the Fair

We will be having a PENNY WAR between the 4-H clubs during county fair. Each club receives their own jug, which will display their club name on it. Money collected will be donated to the Outagamie County 4-H Endowment Fund. First place club will receive \$100; second place \$50. All clubs with \$25 or more in their jug will be eligible for a drawing for a \$25 award. Rules include:

- 1. Pennies count as face value (positive)
- 2. Currency (such as 1's, 5's, 10's, etc.) also count as face value in pennies (positive) [example: one dollar = 100 pennies]
- 3. Any silver coins will be counted toward a negative value (example: a quarter will subtract 25 pennies).

2015 4-H Project Record Books Due

The 4-H member project record books are due to your 4-H club main leader between August 1-15. Main leaders need to work with project leaders and review all the record books before August 31. We expect every 4-H member will honor that deadline date. PARENTS, please give your assistance and

cooperation. Main leaders have several reports to complete following their deadline date.



THE GOLDEN BOOK AWARDS

will be given to members in each age group that excel in their total record book (a special golden achievement award disc). A 4-H member must meet the golden achievement award requirements. Requirements include: 1. A member must receive two or more county awards in their projects. 2. A member must have extra page(s) (stories, photos, etc.) in book with more detail about your projects and activities.



Graduation Requests

Youth may graduate following high school graduation or one year after high school graduation. 4-H members that were enrolled in grade 12 this past year will receive a special letter, so they can indicate if they want to graduate. All graduating members will be recognized at the county 4-H member recognition program in October.
