


1. **Please fill out the application for free and reduced price meals on back of the registration form.**
2. Choose a camp experience. Select your choice(s) of week(s) to attend. Write your choice(s) in the area on the registration form showing 3 event lines. **Beneath these lines please put in your choice(s) for substituting camps in case your first choice(s) is/are full. PLEASE MAKE A COPY OF THE REGISTRATION FORM FOR YOURSELF.**
3. **Send along the \$50.00 non-refundable registration fee** for each camp chosen with your registration. Remainder is due 3 weeks prior to your camp week, unless you have made other arrangements with the camp registrar.
4. Investigate with your church/agency whether they will have any scholarships for camping. If available, please supply that information to us on the registration form. **Any payment made after registration must be accompanied by the name of the camper and name/week of camp for which that payment is for.**
5. Camp fees, **except registration fees**, are refundable for non-participants who **notify the camp registrar at least three weeks before the camp begins.**
6. **Confirmation packets will be mailed to the camper in early April (first round). Please open immediately!!! THE HEALTH HISTORY FORM NEEDS TO BE FILLED OUT (3 PAGES BY THE PARENT(S) AND THE LAST PAGE BY THE DOCTOR). MAKE SURE TO SIGN IN ALL PLACES REQUIRED AND RETURN 3 WEEKS PRIOR TO THE CAMPER'S CAMP.**
