From the Desk of Rabbi Blatt:

If you look at a calendar for the month of November, even a Jewish calendar, you'll notice that there are no Jewish holidays coming up. However, on the fourth Thursday of the month is Thanksgiving, when people across America get together with their families over a festive meal and hopefully express gratitude for the blessing of living in this beloved land of ours.

Historically, the origins of Thanksgiving derive from the Pilgrims who survived the first devastating winter of 1621 in Plymouth, Massachusetts and celebrated over a bountiful meal with the local native American Indians, giving thanks to God for their survival and a good harvest. This scenario, especially the festive meal with the Wampanoag Indians, may be an exaggeration of the facts, considering the real state of relations between the colonists and native American tribes, but it serves our national interests in creating an overall picture of harmony and thanksgiving to God for a successful harvest.

If this all sounds vaguely familiar to the Jewish holiday of Sukkot, there is good reason. The similarities between the two are more than coincidental, and there are many scholars who believe that Sukkot served as the spiritual basis for the American holiday. I will have much more to say about this at my Thanksgiving Shabbat *D'var* (talk). Let me remind you, however, that the Torah describes the festival of Sukkot as “*zman simchateinu*”, that is, “*the Season of our Rejoicing*,” in which the ancient Israelites rejoiced in a successful harvest at the end of the growing season and gave thanks to the Almighty.

While most of us do not grow our own food any more, a little knowledge of our historical origins, both American and Jewish, can induce a powerful sense of appreciation at this time of the year for how truly fortunate we all are.

Wishing you a happy and healthy Thanksgiving holiday.

MY ITALIAN SECRET THE FORGOTTEN HEROES

La Rabinessa Loira Kelman of Congregation Beth Israel will share with us her own family history of survival. She will talk about her family, the Saranos from Milan, and how they were saved in the small Italian village of Mombaroccio, during the Holocaust.

My Italian Secret personified the actions of individual Italians—who rescued thousands of Jews from deportation and death, hiding and protecting them, despite the risks to their own lives and those of their families.

My Italian Secret: The Forgotten Heroes reveals a clandestine Italian resistance movement that helped save many Jews during the Shoah. Among the figures spotlighted is Tour de France cycling champion Gino Bartali (voiced by Oscar nominee Robert Loggia). The film tells the story of brave Italians who defied the Nazis and Fascists to hide, rescue, and protect thousands of innocents during the Holocaust. Also featured is Dr. Giovanni Borromeo, who invented a fictitious disease to defend the Rome hospital where he was hiding Jews as well as other courageous Italians who carried out ingenious schemes to rescue Jews, partisans and refugees from Nazi-occupied Italy. These inspiring acts are recounted by descendants of rescuers and survivors, as well as those who escaped the concentration camps as children.



DELI MAN



"[Deli Man](#)" is the cinematic equivalent of comfort food. Loosely structured around a profile of [David "Ziggy" Gruber](#), a third-generation "Deli Man" and the film's genial tour guide, the documentary is also a history of the American institution of the Jewish delicatessen.
