- A. State and Local Rules and Regulations shall apply.
- B. Exhibitors must have prepared their own entry since the close of last year's fair.
- C. Each food entry must consist of two (2) identical examples: one to be judged and one for the display exhibit. Vinegars, Cordials, Liqueurs, and Syrups excluded. Please refer to Rule F below.
- D. All jars must be standard clear canning jars with a two (2) part lid and ring band closure. No products requiring refrigeration will be accepted. All canning must be in0020sealed jars. No paraffin wax or inversion method.
- E. Labels must be no larger than 2"x2" and must be placed on the side of the jar. Labels must state name of product, date canned, and method used. (Example: the initials W.B. for Water Bath, P.C. for Pressure Canner). Note: Steam-canned or open kettle items will not be allowed to enter. THE NAME OF EXHIBITOR MUST NOT BE ON THIS LABEL.

New: TEEN, YOUTH & 4H: Both jars MUST be labeled on their lids. Fair staff will cover lid with an additional label as to keep anonymous. Adult entries MAY have labels on lid and will be treated anonymously also.

- F. Vinegars, Cordials, Liqueurs, Honey, or Syrups only: Containers must be as follows: One (1) Tamper-Proof, labeled bottle, jar, or other container for the display exhibit and one (1) labeled ½ pint or standard pint canning jar for the judging.
- G. All low or non-acid foods, all vegetables, meats, poultry, and fish must be canned Under Pressure. Low-acid fruit, such as figs, must be made more acidic by adding lemon juice as directed in the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning. Tomatoes and fruits must be canned in a boiling water bath canner.
- H. Dried products must have a minimum of ½ cup in each jar.
- American Judging is traditional placing: One first place, one second and one third places will be awarded.
 Danish judging is when exhibits are judged upon their own merit. There may be more than one first place, second place or third place exhibits.
- J. DUE TO FOOD SAFETY ISSUES, WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ACCEPTING PRODUCTS THAT DO NOT ABIDE BY THE ABOVE RULES
- K. 4H Exhibitors may enter this division if they are a member of an El Dorado County 4H club and enrolled in

Food Preservation. 4H exhibitors are judged by the "Danish" system and receive ribbons, however, no cash prizes with the exception of the Best of Show award sponsored by Umpqua Bank, Pollock Pines.

Artwork not viewable via Firefox MUST be in one of the following formats (jpg or jpeg, gif, tiff, eps, QuickTime movie, PDF, or png) or include the appropriate software and computer specifications required to view the artwork. Software must run on Windows 7 or Macintosh Lion. If project is made in Premiere, After Effects or Flash, please include the native files in addition to the .mov file.
- D. Entries received on DVD must include <u>only</u> the entry(s) to be judged, the software necessary to view it and native files, if applicable. The name of the entry(s) on the entry form MUST be the same as the entry(s) on the disc. All discs must be placed in a sealed envelope also labeled with the entrant's name and address.
- E. All submissions MUST include printed documentation including:
 - 1. The artist's name
 - 2. The title of the artwork
 - 3. The class of the artwork (i.e. Photoshop Photograph, altered or Graphic Design Postcard or Poster, etc.)
 - 4. The software used to create or modify the artwork (i.e. Photoshop, Illustrator, etc.)
 - The type of computer equipment used to create or modify the artwork (i.e. scanner, laser printer, type of computer, etc.)
 - 6. The web address of the artwork (if applicable)
 - A printed copy of the artwork, no larger than 8"x11" (Multiple screen prints will be accepted for video or work with movement; they must still fit within the overall limit specified below. Please print only a few screens to show basic storyline)
 - A brief description of special effects, movement, or sound for multimedia artwork

- G. Work must be family friendly. No nude studies will be accepted.
