PRACTICAL IMPLANTOLOGY STUDY GROUP

This 6 part course is aimed at general practitioners with little to no experience in implant dentistry who would like to advance their knowledge. Addressing issues relating to implant dentistry in a problem solving manner the course is designed to both facilitate complication free implants and advance participants knowledge of factors affecting prosthodontics in general.

Participants are encouraged to bring along study models and radiographs to discuss the placement and restoration of implants, with mentorship of those restoring for the first time.

The seminars are informal and friendly so as to encourage interaction and participation so practitioners can learn simple, safe and reliable techniques when restoring dental implants. There will be a hands-on session on impression taking and implant placement on models. The below listed topics will be covered over the duration of the six evenings.

Learning Outcomes:

At the end of the program participants will have the knowledge to understand the processes of each step involved in the implant process. They will know the different options available, the associated benefits and risks of each option and be competent to answer the following questions:

- Should I offer implants to my patients now?
- What do I need to know before I start?
- What tools do I need?
- Which patients should I refer?
- What cases should I start with?
- Do I do the surgery, the prosthetics or both?
- Where can I get help or advice should something go wrong?
