

### Dear Parish Family,





### RECEPTION OF COMMUNION

Every so often, it is good to remind ourselves of the reverence that we need when we receive the Body and Blood of Christ. We need to be mindful of a few things. When you approach the altar, if you are receiving on the hand, please remove your gloves prior to receiving the Lord. Also, remember to bow slightly before receiving without being ostentatious. If communion runs out and the minister needs to replenish, please wait patiently for their return. If possible stay in your place instead of moving out of line so the procession can flow naturally.

### **HOW TO REPORT ABUSE**

### The Importance and Dignity of the Eucharistic Celebration

The celebration of Mass, as the action of Christ and the People of God...is the center of the whole Christian life for the Church both universal and local, as well as for each of the faithful...It is therefore of the greatest importance that the celebration of the Mass...be so arranged that the sacred ministers and the faithful taking part in it...may derive from it more abundantly those fruits for the sake of which Christ the Lord instituted the Eucharistic Sacrifice of his Body and Blood...

This will best be accomplished if...the entire celebration is planned in such a way that it leads to a conscious, active, and full participation of the faithful both in body and in mind, a participation burning with faith, hope, and charity, of the sort which is desired by the Church and demanded by the very nature of the celebration, and to which the Christian people have a right and duty by reason of their Baptism. (GIRM 16, 17, 18)

## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR Msgr. Bill

Dear Parish Family,

Many of you have expressed concern and prayer for my health these last several weeks as you have noticed my fatigue and weight loss. Early in March I began to have some pain and the doctor sent me to the hospital for two days. After that I began I series of tests as an outpatient to determine what actually was causing my health decline. After those tests it looked to be something serious and I consulted with doctors at a New York Hospital for further evaluation. It was then confirmed that I had a growth in my esophagus. It was not operable. I began chemotherapy treatment on May 2nd at the hospital in New York and this will continue every two weeks. I will also be taking chemo in pill form for seven days and then resting from treatment for seven days. This treatment schedule will continue indefinitely as they determine how I am handling the drug and how the tumor is reacting to the chemo. The fatigue gets to me and then I need to rest. I am trying to keep up my strength with as much food as I can eat, especially, good soups and chocolate milk shakes. With the help of your prayers and support I will be able to endure the treatment and diminish the effect of the disease. Thank you for praying and thank you for your love, care and interest. While I continue to do all that I can do while I am under treatment Father Jim has been a great support to me.
