SCRIP Update

These are only 25 of the over 900 retailers that participate in Covenant's SCRIP program. SCRIP is a fundraising program that helps Covenant earn money with the items that you already buy – groceries, medications, gas, sporting goods, craft supplies, books, lawn and household equipment, etc. By purchasing gift cards ahead of time from the SCRIP program, and then using those cards to pay for your purchases, Covenant earns money.

We carry 16 retailers in inventory each and every week on a first come, first served basis. In addition you can place orders with the SCRIP volunteers on Sundays or through ShopWithScrip.com - the website that allows you to place your order online. Mother's Day. Graduations & Father's Day are both coming up in the next few months and are great opportunities to get your SCRIP feet wet. Ideas may include gifts from department stores like Belk's, Dillard's, and J.C. Penney's; Home and Gardening items from Lowe's Home Improvement or Home Depot; recent bestsellers from Barnes and Noble; going out to eat at a favorite restaurant (too many possibilities to list them all); or even just finding them that perfect card from Hallmark. All of these retailers (any many, many more) participate in the SCRIP program and are great ways for you to try SCRIP.
