Body of Works	Holistic piece(s) of art. It may be one or many pieces that show conceptual strength and meaning— technical refinement — coherent point of view.
Media	The materials used by an artist to make an artwork, e.g. oil paint on canvas, pastels and watercolour on paper, carved wood, etc.
Theme	the subject of a talk, piece of writing, exhibition, etc.; a topic.
Medium	Medium can refer to both to the type of art (e.g. painting, sculpture, printmaking), as well as the materials an artwork is made from
Techniques	the manner and ability with which an artist employs the technical skills of a particular art or field of endeavour. The body of specialized procedures and <b>methods</b> used in any specific field.
Subject matter	In artwork, the subject matter would be what the artist has chosen to paint, draw or sculpt.
Artists Statement	Your artist statement is about facts, a basic introduction to your art; WHY YOU MAKE YOUR ART, WHAT INSPIRES YOU TO MAKE IT, WHAT IT SIGNIFIES OR REPRESENTS, WHAT'S UNIQUE OR SPECIAL ABOUT HOW YOU MAKE IT, and briefly, WHAT IT MEANS TO YOU.
