DYING TO LIVE – It's the last thing we ever do, and it's the last thing we want to think about ... our own dying and death. It was, on the other hand, the thing that Jesus embraced with clear-eyed resolve and determination. He set out to Jerusalem to die *well*, as God had called him to do. If we are to follow in His footsteps as His disciples, then we, too, must face our death with clear-eyed resolve to die well ... to die *gloriously*. DYING TO LIVE "THE LAST THING YOU EVER DO"

Mark 8:31-38 (NIV84)

31 He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. **32** He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

33 But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the things of God, but the things of men."

34 Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. **35** For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me and for the gospel will save it. **36** What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul? **37** Or what can a man give in exchange for his soul? **38** If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."

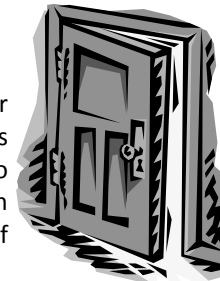
