1. What are the Read-A-thon Dates?

Students will track the amount of time they read per day from February 16th-March 1st

2. How does the Read-A-thon work?

Students ask sponsors to donate either a lump sum in support of their reading during the two weeks or to donate a certain amount of money (for example: 5 cents per minute) for every minute that you read during the Read-A-thon.

3. Why are we doing this?

There are TWO reasons why we are doing this!

- The Read-A-thon gives students an opportunity to raise money for the school and help fund projects like library programs, cultural arts and artists presentations and author visits and classroom supports.
- Reading is fun! It frees your imagination, increases your vocabulary, and helps you to improve your concentration and critical thinking skills. Unlike TV, books make you to use your brain. By reading, you think more and become smarter. Participating in TV Turnoff? There is always more time to read!

4. Do we have to collect donations to participate? No, No, No!

The most important part of a Read-A-thon is that you READ!

Prizes!

How to Collect Read-A-Thon Pledges

When the Read-A-Thon is over on March 1, 2013 it's time to collect your pledges!

Here's what to do:

Step #1: On the Reading Log, total all of the minutes you read each day.

Step #2: Take that number and multiply that by the amount the person pledged. If you need help ask an adult.

Example: Total minutes read= 300 x.05 (5 cents pledged per minute)

Total money owed= \$15.00 (Remember the decimal point!)

Reminder: Not everyone may have pledged the same amount per minute, so be sure you do the math each time the pledge is different. Work with a grown up.

Step #3: Call each person who pledged. Ask that person to send you a check or cash for the amount they owe. Don't forget to say thank you!

Reminder: Checks are made out to Tuscan PTA

Ask them to write Read-A-Thon and your name on the check.

Step #4: Please include the tear off information below, write Read-A-Thon and your name and grade on the envelope. Bring it to school and give it the office or your teacher by March 8, 2013.

Step #5: Thank you! You're done! You've helped the school achieve its goal!
Give yourself a big pat on the back!
