Summary:

This document is a yearly, renewal application for the Carroll County Bureau of Aging and Disabilities, Senior Inclusion Program. This renewal application is in compliance with COMAR Regulation 10.22.06.

This is the third year that the Senior Inclusion Program is operating with two (2) licenses under the Developmental Disabilities Administration. These two (2) licenses are Family and Individual Support Services (FISS) COMAR Regulation 10.22.06 and Day Habilitation COMAR Regulation 10.22.07.

Family and Individual Support Service funding is through a Memorandum of Understanding and the COMAR 10.22.06 Regulation license has been in place since 1992. The Day Habilitation COMAR 10.22.07 Regulation has been in place since 2008 and payment is through a fee payment system per client times their daily attendance. The attendance for each client is recorded daily on the Provider Consumer Information System 2 (PCIS 2) website. The reimbursement rate per client is based on a county provider rate and an individual component determined by the clients' physical health and supervision needs.

**History**: Since 1987, the Bureau of Aging and Disabilities has received funds through the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene's Developmental Disabilities Administration, to serve older adults with developmental disabilities.

The Senior Inclusion Program's purpose is to provide diverse structured and non-structured community-based generic services and therapeutic retirement activities for older adults with developmental disabilities. A variety of educational, social, recreational, health and nutrition programs are designed and implemented by five (5) staff. The number of staff has increased from last year due the seven new older adults with developmental disabilities in the program. There are now twenty-two (22) members, and a fiscal increase of \$69,838. Currently, new adults are being referred to the program.

The Senior Inclusion Program collaborates with Change Inc., Target Inc., ARC of Carroll County, Flying Colors of Success, and other agencies. This partnership allows these agencies to refer individuals to us who are looking for a productive retirement program.

The Carroll County Senior Inclusion Program continues to be the only one of its kind in the nation to provide retirement programs for older adults with developmental disabilities, mainstreaming them into a senior center environment.

**Funding:** The FY2012 FISS award, effective 7/1/11 - 6/30/12: \$23,036.

The FY 2012 Day Habilitation award 7/1/11- 6/30/12: \$214,096 County match: \$40,100. County funds, in the amount of \$6,817 are used towards the ISS grant and \$33,283 towards the Day Habilitation grant. The County match offsets salary and fringe costs.

#### **Background:**

During the October 18, 2011 meeting of the Carroll County Planning & Zoning Commission, the Commission approved the Fiscal Year 2011 Concurrency Management Report and voted to forward the report to the Board of County Commissioners.

The Department of Land Use, Planning & Development presented the report to the Board of County Commissioners at the December 8, 2011 meeting. At that meeting, the Commissioners approved the staff request to schedule a public hearing for the proposed amendments to Chapter 71, *Adequate Public Facilities and Concurrency Management*, that are identified in the FY11 Concurrency Management Report.

The public hearing was conducted on February 9, 2012. One citizen commented via email. The Commissioners elected to continue the comment period for ten days. At the conclusion of the comment period, all comments received and a comment summary will be appended to this briefing paper.

The proposed amendments add detached and attached accessory dwellings to the list of uses that Chapter 71 does not apply to. The proposed amendments also include using a 24-month period for review of fire and EMS late and no responses, and minor changes to the required contents of the yearly concurrency management report.

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Bureau of Purchasing solicited proposals from qualified firms to perform surface geophysical services to include field data collection, data management and interpretation as well as reporting at the project site described herein.

Carroll County Government is undertaking a water supply development project in the Union Mills watershed area. This area is drained by the Big Pipe Creek, which flows west, southwest through the northern portion of Carroll County and empties to the Monocacy River in Frederick County.

The first phase of this project will be to assess groundwater resources in the watershed. To that end, Carroll County Government is undertaking a groundwater exploration effort to identify and drill optimum locations based on non-intrusive hydrogeologic techniques including surface geophysics. The overall goal of the surface geophysical survey is to identify favorable locations for groundwater exploration. To achieve this goal, the geophysical survey must identify subsurface geologic structures, geologic contacts, as well as hydrogeologic features, cavities, fractures, and/or other discontinuities which may indicate the existence of favorable subsurface conditions for water supply development.

The Bureau of Purchasing in cooperation with the Department of Land Use and Development received proposals for the above project. An evaluation committee three (3) members was formed to conduct technical and financial review of the proposals submitted. The Committee evaluated all proposals based on criteria detailed in the proposal. Once this was completed, the committee members come to consensus and recommend the best value proposal for the work required. The final overall ranking denotes the order of selection. The highest ranked firm for this project is Golder Associates. This expenditure is within the project budget and no additional funds will be needed.

#### Issue:

Application to the Chesapeake Bay Trust (CBT) for funding through the Watershed Assistance Grant Program. Funding is being requested to develop a watershed assessments for the Tuckers Branch, Middle Run, and the Gillis Falls Watersheds located in the South Branch of the Patapsco.

#### **Background:**

In response to requirements specified in our National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit relating to assessment of water quality within all of the county's watersheds; the Bureau of Resource Management actively looking at ways in which to offset the cost associated with these efforts. Partnerships with neighboring jurisdictions, the local community, the Board of Education, and other governmental entities are steps in the right direction. The Chesapeake Bay Trust (CBT) and the Maryland Department of Natural Resources are soliciting grant applications for their 2011-2012 Watershed Assistance Grant Program. These grants are designed to support watershed planning efforts and the design of watershed restoration projects in Maryland. Planning projects include watershed characterizations, surveys, assessments, action plans, or financing strategies. Local governments are invited to submit requests for watershed planning assistance. The planning efforts are to consist of watershed assessments which would include establishing a baseline of watershed conditions and create a framework for identifying future restoration projects.

The Bureau of Resource Management has prepared an application for the March 9, 2012 deadline to request funding to complete a watershed assessment for Tuckers Branch, Middle Run, and the Gillis Falls Watersheds located in the South Branch of the Patapsco.

#### **Budget:**

The county is requesting funding from the Chesapeake Bay Trust to cover the costs associated with hiring a contractor to perform the Stream Corridor Assessment (SCA) in Tuckers Branch, Middle Run, and the Gillis Falls Watersheds. Carroll County Government in-kind match consists of support to complete the SCA process, such as meetings, data management, and property owner permissions. Essentially, Carroll County Government will facilitate the selected contractor being able to complete the field effort. The grant will fund up to \$35,000.



# Department of Land Use, Planning and Development Transportation Enhancement Program Briefing Paper February 23, 2012 Open Session

**Issue:** Application for Transportation Enhancement Program (TEP) funding for the stormwater management facility being constructed at the corner of Route 91 (Emory Road) and Congoleum Drive. Program funds are Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) reimbursement program funds passed through the Maryland State Highway Administration.

#### **Background:**

The Bureau of Resource Management, in conjunction with the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit Compliance Program, is currently processing a concept design to enlarge an existing pond owned by the Reese Volunteer Fire Department to address stormwater management regulations. The approximate size of the facility is four (4) acres and will treat over 150 acres of currently untreated drainage area (40 acres of impervious area). The cost estimate for the project is \$1,521,415.85 which includes engineering, construction and a 10% contingency. The pond is being designed to provide water quality management on all impervious areas and channel protection management for the one year storm.

After review of the Program Overview for the Transportation Enhancement Program, it was determined that this project may qualify for funding. If approved, up to 50% of the project could be funded through the Transportation Enhancement Program.
