## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents/Caregivers,

## **Faulco Friends Update**

Yesterday afternoon the final details of the Licence Agreement between Mrs Rhonda Miller (Faulco Friends) and the Asset Management Unit (AMU) representative Mr Glen Walker, were completed and this ensures Faulco Friends will continue to provide after school hours care at the school.

The meeting of Mr Paul Cole, School Education Director, Mr Carl Robinson, AMU representatives, Mrs Rhonda Miller supported by Mrs Dellena Talbot and I confirmed that Faulco Friends will continue to use areas adjacent to the school hall most of the time, except when school events etc are held there. In that eventuality, the performing arts room (Ms Theoharis' room) will be used.

This is a positive conclusion to the transition from a Community Use Agreement to the Licence, and I am sure is good news for all involved in the process.

## **Road Safety Reminder**

Mr John O'Sullivan has asked me to remind parents, caregivers and students of the importance of complying with road safety rules. Please ensure that students consistently use the pedestrian crossing, as Grose Road is particularly busy during the before and after school rush.

## **Springwood High School Expo**

Our Year 6 students are at the High School today, learning about what to expect next year as they go into Year 7. We appreciate that the staff at the High School are organising this and similar events to ensure a smooth transition for our students.

### **A Block Painting**

As with the erection of the new school sign, the days of rain are affecting the progress of the painting. However, the section of the

building that has been completed looks very attractive, and the new colours match the Hall and the Library trim, giving this area a more unified appearance.

#### **Student Welfare**

The learning Support team focus is on individual students and their needs and on whole school programs and initiatives which address our core values of Positive Relationships, Personal Growth, Healthy Environments and Learning.

Physical Health is promoted with teaching and learning about nutrition, exercise and prevention strategies relating to Sun Smart and road safety. Our children's mental health is promoted by implementing KidsMatter and Bounce Back programs. As there are a significant number of new staff at the school, these two programs will be a focus for Professional Learning during the Term 2 School Development Days. Mrs Margaret Tafe, who was instrumental in the introduction of these programs, will help support new staff members in this process.

The Learning Support Team focus for the next two weeks will be updating students' education plans.

## **Individual Education Plans (IEPs)**

IEPs are implemented for students who receive Integration Funding Support. The class teacher, School Learning Support Coordinator, parents, carers and other people involved in supporting these students have been, or soon will be, contacted to arrange a suitable time for these planning meetings.

## Personalised Learning Plans (PLPs)

PLPs are developed for students who identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander, and again the planning involves teachers, parents and support staff.

## **School Learning Support Coordinator (SLSC)**

Mrs Jodie Zarzinski, the SLSC, works with students and supports staff who are working with students with special needs. She is available on Tuesdays. Due to her recent illness Mrs Nicole Kowald has at times taken this role.

### **Best Start Letter**

Kindergarten students received a note to inform parents that the best Start assessment is now available at the office. The teachers have completed the assessments and the parent information as early as possible for parents. If you have not picked up your child's assessment information, please come to the office at your earliest convenience.

## Shave for a cure

Max Ogle, School Captain, is participated in the World's Greatest Shave in 2012 and raised over \$600 for the Leukemia Foundation, which was well over his expected goal of \$250. This year he has raised the goal to \$500 and will be participating in the World's Greatest Shave at School. Max has not had a haircut since last year as he wanted to grow the biggest 'fro' for the event to make it really special.

On Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March a Hairdresser from The Gun Shearer, Springwood, will be coming to the school to shave Max's hair. The event will be at 11am in the Faulconbridge Public School Hall. Students who would like to see Max getting the big shave and to donate to the cause will be encouraged to bring a gold coin donation as entry into the hall.

Max has had two Grandparents diagnosed with cancer and has watch them go through the treatment process. For Max it is "just hair" compared to what others have to go through. The money raised helps the Leukemia Foundation support people with blood cancer and their families. It also funds vital research into better treatments and cures for leukemia, lymphoma and myeloma.

## **Kindy Update**

Our Kindergarten classes have settled well into the routines of school. Stage sport, singing, dancing and assemblies are now underway. Our home reading and sight word programs are about to begin. Kindy teachers are currently implementing programs in their classrooms that students will be able to apply in the less structured environment of the playground. The lessons explicitly address the social, interpersonal and communication skills needed to make friends, play games, take turns, share materials, remain safe, and to identify and deal with feelings. The play equipment used in such lessons will then be used in the playground where Kindy children can apply the skills. The program affirms our school's core values and aligns with the social and emotional skills within Kids Matter.

## **FYI:** free app to the stars UWS Observatory iPhone app



University of Western Sydney Observatory has developed an iPhone app to help bring the news of the universe to the palms of the community. The app is titled 'UWS Observatory' and is free from the iTunes Store. It provides an automatically updated calendar detailing both astronomical events, such as eclipses, meteor showers and moon phases, and a list of public astronomy programs being run at the observatory. The 'observatory calendar' includes the scheduled date and time of each of these programs, the topic of the presentation, a short description and the cost. The UWS Observatory app also contains details about the observatory itself, including an interactive map showing directions to the facility, entry fees and contact details. The Observatory is hosting 'Kids Astronomy Nights' in the April school holidays.


