### **STAYCATION**

Staycation defined: A vacation where you stay at or near your home.

A staycation can be as much fun and as relaxing as any vacation!



### Tips:

- ⇒ **Begin with a budget.** Divide the dollar amount you have available to spend by the average cost per day of the vacation of choice. This will give you the number of days you can realistically spend on vacation. Design your vacation around your available funds, not the number of days you can take off work.
- ⇒ **Schedule start and end dates** just as you would for a regular vacation.
- ⇒ **Set a limit of how far you want to travel.** It can be anything from a couple hundred miles to staying right in your own backyard.
- ⇒ Pack your time full of activities. Once you have picked a maximum distance, start trying to find activities, places or events within your limits.
- ⇒ **Declare a "choratorium".** This means NO CHORES! Don't make the bed, vacuum, clean closet, do yard work. You're on vacation!
- ⇒ **Take staycation photos or videos** just as you would if you went away from home for your vacation.

### Idea #1 - Set up an Ice Cream Sundae Bar

- 1. **Ice Cream** Purchase several flavors or use Neapolitan which has three flavors in one box, thus saving money. If you want a low-fat/low-calorie version, try buying reduced fat flavors of ice cream or frozen yogurt.
- 2. **Toppings** Purchase a variety of toppings. One money saving tip for sauces is to use jam and thin it with water. Jam is less expensive than traditional toppings found in the ice cream section at the grocery store. Experiment using the all-fruit, reduced sugar, or no sugar versions of jam. Saving between 10-40 calories per tablespoon can make a big difference.
- 3. **Additions** Provide some special toppings, i.e. whipped cream, chopped nuts, shredded coconut, sprinkles, etc. Crumbled cookies are another treat and don't forget cherries for the top!
- 4. **Set all ingredients out** and provide everyone with a large bowl to make their own sundae.
- 5. **Sit together and enjoy.** Take turns having each person describe how they made their sundae.

### Idea #2 - Make Homemade Play Dough

1 c. flour 1 c. warm water 2 t. cream of tartar 1 t. oil 1/4 c. salt food coloring Mix all ingredients, adding food coloring last. Stir over medium heat until smooth. Remove from pan. Cool until it can be handled, then knead until blended and smooth. Place in a plastic bag or airtight container when completely cooled. Will last for a long time!
