#### Hospitality and Membership -

Vicki Bunker reported 63 in attendance. Please consider signing up as a hostess.

Barb Quamme reported one new member, Jackie Martz,.

#### Old business -

**Quilt Show 2015** – Suzanne Gandrud reported that she has four Bright Birches patterns left. Sheets have been put out to enlist volunteers for committees for the show. It was recommended that you "like" and "share" the Quilt Show on Facebook. This would be an advertising tool and would encourage new members.

**Quilts and Coffee** – Leslee Smart reported that there were 81 in attendance at Pat Knoechel's presentation. Members felt that we need to return to having treats, but that cookies or bars would be sufficient.

The August minutes were approved as published.

**Treasurer's Report** – Anna Picklo reported a balance of \$7,898.33 in the general fund and a balance of \$17,568.76 in the Long Range Educational Planning fund with a grand total of \$25,467.09 as of Sept. 15, 2015.

MaryAnn Hentschell made a motion to approve the report with a second by Suzanne Gandrud. Motion approved.

#### Old Rusiness

Audit – Janet Gregory gave a report on the audit conducted on our records. A check to Optimal Pregnancy Outcome Center from a year ago had not been cashed. Payment will be stopped on this check and a new one will be issued. Suggestions were made to improve the bookkeeping and Anna will implement them. Suzanne Gandrud made a motion to reissue the check for \$112.14 and stop payment on the uncashed check with a second by Leslee Smart. Motion carried.

**Quilt Show 2015** – Oct. 16-18, 2015 Suzanne Gandrud reported that things are going smoothly and everything is on schedule. The early quilt entry deadline is September 18. Various committee chairs explained what the volunteer duties are for their areas.

**Quilts and Coffee** – Communication was received from Doug Leko of Antler Quilting regarding arrangements in case of a snow storm. Arrangements will be made with him. We are still in need of one or two members to chair Quilts and Coffee for this program to continue.

#### **New Business:**

Recruitment – The information gathered in September was reviewed. It was agreed that a task force would be developed to implement some of the ideas to improve membership. Ideas will be solicited again in October.

Meeting Location – Dianne Sattler and Judi Loer met with Our Saviors Lutheran in E. Grand Forks. They toured the meeting room area and kitchen area. It is a great facility and the parking is more than ample. They will charge \$100 which is what we pay now. Judi Loer made a motion to recommend this facility as a meeting place with a second by Anna Picklo. Motion carried. It will tentatively start in Jan. 2016. Board members will bring this to the General meeting in October for discussion and vote.

**Member at Large** – Judi Loer brought up the issue of no treats at the Quilts and Coffee and we will return to them with the next coffee.

**Education Committee** – Bette Olson said that 249 items were made for OPOP. She has programs lined up through March 2016.

The next regular meeting will be Oct. 3, 2015 at the University Lutheran Church.

The next board meeting will be held Oct. 27, 2015 at 2650  $26^{\rm th}$  Ave. S. at 7 PM.



# Recipe Corner

Walnut-Date Snack Bars Mary Peterson



 $^{3}\!\!_{4}$  cup packed light brown sugar

34 cup margarine or butter, melted

2 eggs

2 cups chopped dates ( I use a Dole pouch of chopped dates...)

2 cups chopped walnuts

Combine cake mix and brown sugar – blend well. Add margarine and eggs – then beat 2 minutes at medium speed. In a medium bowl, combine dates and nuts – mix well. Stir the date mixture into the cake batter – blend well. Batter will be stiff! Spread in a greased 9 X 13 pan. Bake 35-45 minutes at 350 degrees. Cool 10 minutes and run a table knife along the edges to loosen... (I don't always do this). Let cool an hour... cut into bars.

It's one of my favorite bars......packs well, ships well, carries to meetings well, almost tastes like breakfast!

### NSQG Outreach Information

Our Purpose: Create quilts to be given to foster care children in our surrounding area. They are distributed through NEHS.

Occasional outreach projects are done for Optimum Pregnancy Outcome, Quilts of Valor, and the Fire Department for distribution to fire victims' families in our area.

#### We count on these donations from our membership:

<u>Time</u> - work on projects on your own, with friends, or through workshops and kits offered by the guild Machine quilting Tying

Binding

Quilts - we accept tops and finished quilts of all sizes

Must be cotton fabric, clean and free of stains or
pet hair

<u>Fabric</u> - Larger pieces that could be used for backings if donating smaller pieces we would prefer these cuts:

½ yard cuts or larger, fat quarters, 2½" strips, 5" squares, 10" squares
Panels

Any size cuts of brights or kid prints are especially appreciated

Batting - we prefer a low loft batting (could be pieced together from left over scraps from larger projects.)

NSQG offers at least three opportunities throughout the year to help with outreach. March and October-technique/project workshop, December-tying quilts.

A designated outreach table is set up at meetings. Feel free throughout the year to assemble quilt tops or completed quilts and drop them off at our guild meetings. Finished quilts are stored at Quilter's Eden. They can be dropped off there also.

Kits are available at guild meetings for members to take home and work on at their leisure-no time restrictions, just a reminder that the purpose is for outreach.

December Meeting is traditionally the time we make a donation to NEHS. Our yearly goal would be 100+completed quilts. This would mean if each member could donate at least one quilt per year, we would easily reach that number. We know that many of you do 3 or more donations per year. We thank our satellite groups that have gathered to help sort donations, assemble kits, etc. We especially appreciate the long armers in our guild for their generous contribution of quilting.

We often hear that someone donated a quilt and never saw it again. Have no fear! They all make it to someone that is in need of comfort. Sometimes, they go out as quick as we receive them. Sometimes, it may take a while before it gets to the completion point of distribution.

NEHS has requested that rather than donating all of our finished quilts at one time, that we break it down into several donations per year. This would alleviate them and us from having to store so many for so long.

If you donate a quilt, please share it during show and tell! Everyone would love to see it and it will inspire others to contribute to the cause!

NSQG thanks you all for your generous donation of time and talent! Know that you have warmed someone's heart and home!
