

Smallpox Eradication Commemoration 2010 (SEC2010)

Thank you note delivered by Jean Roy at the WHO smallpox eradication commemoration unveiling of bronze grouping in Geneva on 17 May 2010.

Dear Drs. Chan, Mahler, Henderson and Colleagues,

On behalf of the Smallpox Eradication Commemoration 2010 Secretariat and its Board members, I would like to express our gratitude for the generous support we have received from corporations, foundations, public health groups, and individuals, many of whom are with us today.

It is the strong determination of former smallpox workers from around the world that has given us this monument to commemorate this 30th year anniversary. It was this same determination they displayed in the field to eradicate a disease that as recently as 1967 — in the lifetime of many of us — was responsible for an estimated 3 million deaths and social stigma from the scarring it left behind.
