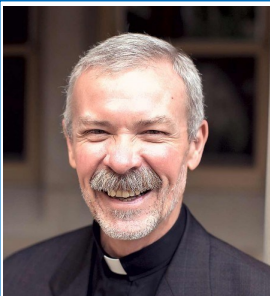
## Mission Forward: Call Committee Formed

## ELCA Malaria Campaign

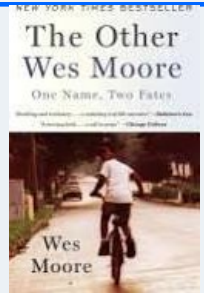

## Spiritual Care

There are times when we all need to be lifted up and supported by prayer, either for ourselves or for those we love. Mount Olive supports, we support our members through prayer in a variety of ways. For many years we have had a prayer chain faithfully maintained by Kathie Branes. At any given time the prayer chain has approximately 75 members who are connected by email. If you are experiencing a particular need in your life or the life of a friend or loved one, the prayer chain is a way to express that need and know that many people in our community will pray for you or your loved one. Kathie posts updates to the prayer chain regularly through email and she removes people from the prayer chain at their request. We also lift people up in prayer during worship as part of the prayers of the people. Most often these prayers are for members of the congregation who are experiencing long term illness, surgery, or the loss of a loved one. If you would like to be identified in the prayers of the people or to have a loved one mentioned please speak directly to a pastor. Thank you.

Finally, there are prayer request cards located in the pew racks. These cards may be placed in the offering plate and are given directly to a pastor. Pastors have historically considered these prayer request cards to be private requests for prayer; they range greatly from children requesting prayers for the loss of a beloved pet to ongoing difficult matters that the pastors are aware of to a one time prayer request. There is a box that can be checked if you desire a pastoral call. Please check that if you do. Filling out a prayer request card does not mean that request will be on the Sunday morning prayers nor does it mean that it will be on the prayer chain; those are more public means of prayer. Some people prefer for the requests to be kept private, some public and our desire is to respect both wishes.

### Updates on IHN/Family Promise



Interfaith Hospitality Network of Greater Rochester has changed its name to Family Promise Rochester, a more recognizable name, shared with the national office and many of their Affiliates across the country. The mission remains the same: mobilizing communities to help families without homes become self-sufficient.

Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN), the program uniting diverse faith organizations, volunteers and social services to provide shelter and food remains Family Promise Rochester's core program.

Family Promise Rochester's program expansion includes new Community Housing options, a Wheels to Work program which provides transportation to working adults, a revamped Family Stabilization Program, and longer-term case management. The Mentors of Promise, a pilot mentoring initiative, is also being developed.

Trent Fluegel, Executive Director of Family Promise of Rochester, made the name change announcement at the 2014 IHN Choral Concert at Bethel Lutheran Church. The concert was a success with over \$11,000 raised!

There are many ways you can volunteer and keep IHN a smoothly running ministry at Mount Olive:

- Drive the IHN van to transport guests
- Evening Host, 5-8 pm
- Cook and serve evening meal, 5-7 pm
- Overnight Host, 8 pm-8 am
- Cook assistant, 5-7 pm
- Set-up and Tear down

Training every three years is required to volunteering for the various tasks with the exception of Set-up and Tear down.
