
HOTEL RESERVATIONS

Take I-90 to I-5 North. From Interstate 5 North, exit onto Madison Street (exit 165A). Turn left at the first light after exciting and then turn right onto 6th Ave. Drive for 8 blocks down 6th Avenue and cross over Steward Street. The hotel will be on the left.
