

Hall Board Update

Love Your Lodge Campaign

Revenues are down significantly from last year due to slower rental activity but the Board voted to pursue several badly needed projects (see below). We hope that these will be completed during the month of August, paving the way to stucco or paint the building. Our preference is to stucco the building which will greatly improve its appearance and be a longer-term solution, but finances remain a major obstacle and we're not sure if we'll have the funds. Beyond that, there's the cost of a new roof overhang or awning. If you have not contributed to the Love Your Lodge Campaign, we encourage you to do so. Contributions to date total \$8,500 which is a godsend but the majority was contributed by just a handful of individuals. We thank them dearly, but need more participation from the Membership at large. There are many who give freely of their time, talent and resources to support the Lodge but they can't do it all and we need more participation. If you're capable of contributing, this is your call! Mange tusen takk.

Projects

Projects to be completed in August include the following. Thanks again to **Don Schallock** for guiding the process along.

- Replacing the kitchen door
- Installing a light and motion detector over the kitchen door
- Rebuilding the frame around the double entry doors to the Main Hall
- Stucco repairs on the south and west walls of the building
- Installing horizontal flashing along the south wall to accommodate a roof overhang or awning
- Installing vertical flashing on the west wall to prevent moisture intrusion

Sound System

Based on the feedback we received from those who attended the August 9 business meeting, the sound system is working great. Again, special thanks are due to **Kato Andersen** and **Dave Melius**.

WiFi System

Comcast has been extraordinarily slow in installing cable for the phone, TV and Wifi system. **John Stubblebine** has been persistent and we hope that installation will be complete by the end of August.

Pilot Lights

The pilot lights on the kitchen stove frequently get blown out which leaves the odor of gas in the building. The problem is, if the kitchen door is left open, the wind is often strong enough to blow the pilot lights out. Please be aware of the problem, and try not to leave the door open when it's windy and relight the pilots as necessary.

Lutefisk Tent

Believe it or not, lutefisk preparations are just around the corner. For those who have not participated, putting up and taking down the tent is a real chore and several poles were bent by the heavy wind and rain last year. Dave Melius straightened the poles as best he could but it would be a blessing to replace the tent with something more manageable. To the rescue, Fred Hymans has offered to contribute a 10x20' tent that he no longer uses. This is similar to the tents seen at farmer's markets which are much easier to set up, take down and store than what we have now. With sufficient tie downs, we hope that the new tent will work well and be a boon to lutefisk activities. Thank you Fred!!






