## **Bowing In**

In Bethlehem, a large, old church marks the spot where some believe Jesus was born. Tourists visiting the Church of the Nativity quickly notice a peculiar architectural feature: the entrance to this massive building is so small that all but the littlest visitors have to duck low to enter it. The idea is that the tiny door forces all who enter to bow before they can see the mystery of Christ. This appropriately named "Door of Humility" is like the opposite of an amusement park ride: You have to be *this small* to enter.

The rich young man and the disciples discover in today's gospel that the same is true for the kingdom of God: you have to be small to enter it. The news of salvation in Jesus Christ is only good news to those who need it. And when we feel big and in charge and things are going well—as they were for the rich young man—it is easy to pretend that we are completely self-sufficient and that the things and gifts we have are ours alone.

But life—both in its wonder and its tragedy—often cuts us down to size. Gazing at nature or learning about science and history reminds us that we are actually quite small and insignificant in the grand scheme of things. Illness and age remind us that our bodies are fragile and we are not all-powerful. Losses and setbacks remind us that all we are and have comes from God and goes back to God.

This the truth, but it is not the whole story. We may be small, but we are also claimed and loved through baptism by the God for whom "all things are possible" (Mark 10:27). Out of our smallness, weakness, and lostness, God is fashioning a new world that has already been ushered in through Christ. Let us bow down and enter in!





Trinity's Mission Appeal, BIGGER Than A Building! (BTAB) will not only pay down the mortgage on our building, it is also a vision to grow our ministries, serve others, and share God's love. Many Trinity members spent the summer visioning about new ministries that our congregation could develop in the future. Working with David Misenheimer, a consultant from Kairos and Associates, we were encouraged to dream big and envision how Trinity could grow in service to God. The Visioning group determined that a new position of Connections Coordinator would be necessary to accomplish our ministry development ideas. All Trinity members were asked to participate online in the Church Assessment Tool (CAT) that helped us gather information to guide our decisions and provided a clearer picture of who we are as a church and what directions might be important for our future. Our visioning ideas and CAT resulted in An Emerging Vision for Trinity Lutheran Church, shared with the

congregation at Listening Group sessions in August and September.

Paying down our mortgage and reducing our debt is a vital part of BTAB. As of 1. August 2015, Trinity still owes \$759,659, on its mortgage. With this three-year mission appeal, we will reduce our facility mortgage by making our monthly payments from BTAB. (\$80,000 yearly for 3 years for a total of \$240,000). We will use 75% of BTAB money received beyond the \$240,000 reserved for mortgage payments to further reduce our debt, and we will use 25% beyond the \$240,000 for ministry. Council has set the following BTAB financial goals:

Basic Goal — \$550,000 Challenge Goal — \$700,000 DEBT FREE Goal — \$1,000,000

The **\$550,000 goal** would provide \$472,500 for mortgage payments and \$77,500 for Ministry Development.

The **\$700,000 goal** would provide \$585,000 for mortgage payments and \$115,000 for Ministry Development.

The **DEBT FREE Goal of \$1,000,000** would provide \$810,000 to pay down the remainder of the mortgage and \$190,000 for Ministry Development.

The Kick-off date for BIGGER Than A Building! is 18. October.

**Commitment Sunday is 15. November, for both BIGGER Than A Building! and Trinity's annual Stewardship Campaign**. There will be two pledge cards: one for Trinity's 3-year BTAB Mission Appeal and one for Trinity's annual Stewardship Campaign. We encourage you to pray and discern your household's most generous response to both the BTAB mission appeal and the Stewardship Campaign. Consider the many gifts your faith has given to you and let your giving reflect your many blessings.
