PROCEDURE FOR THE FORMULATION AND SUBMISSION OF JUDGING PANELS

- At a Specialty Show held apart from an All-Breed Show (Independent Specialty), more than one judge may be invited to officiate if the club so desires. If the name of more than one judge is submitted on this form, the assignments may be designated on this form, or permission may be granted (if requested on page 3 of this form and the arrangement is announced in the premium list for the show) to draw for the assignment of each judge prior to the start of the judging of the breed.
- After consulting the AKC's *Judges Directory*, draw up a proposed list of judges. The AKC suggests that you work together with the Superintendent or Show Secretary. Take great care in estimating the number of dogs a judge's assignment will entail so that the problems resulting from overloads after entries close can be minimized. Remember that Obedience classes count in a judge's total. If the entry for any Obedience judge exceeds the Obedience limits, see the *Obedience Regulations*, Chapter 1, Sections 26 through 30 for the explanation of entry reassignment.
- **Note:** the maximum number of dogs assigned in the breed judging to any one judge in one day shall never exceed 200. If there is only one judge, and the assigned entry exceeds 200, one additional judge shall be assigned to the class(es) with the smallest number of entries needed to bring the original judge's assignment within the limits.
- If more than one judge is to officiate (<u>Rules Applying to Dog Shows</u>, Chapter 6, Section 5): For breeds with Varieties, assignments may be divided according to variety. If the division is made in this way, one of the judges must be designated as the judge of Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, and any competition in which more than one variety competes.
 - If TWO JUDGES are to officiate: All dog classes (regular and additional) for one judge. All bitch classes (regular and additional) for one judge. Best of Winners, Best of Variety and Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Variety (when applicable), Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, and any competition not divided by sex to be assigned to either one of the two judges.
 - If THREE JUDGES are to officiate: All dog classes (regular and additional) for one judge. All bitch classes (regular and additional) for one judge. Best of Winners, Best of Variety and Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Variety (when applicable), Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, and any competition not divided by sex for one judge.
- Write to judges setting forth the judge's entire assignment. REMEMBER, contracts must be specific.
- Before submitting this form, you must have in your possession a letter or specific contract from each judge listed herein that expressly accepts the entire assignment listed for that judge on this form (*Rules Applying to Dog Shows*, Chapter 4, Section 1). The AKC reserves the right to request the acceptance letter of any or all judges on this panel.
- With the exception of visiting judges, all judges must be eligible for the entire assignment listed in the proposed panel on the date the panel is submitted to AKC. Judges who are in the process of being considered for additional classes by the Board of Directors may not be assigned a class(es) for which they are applying.
- This form may be submitted at any time to the American Kennel Club, PO Box 900051 Raleigh, NC 27675-9051, fax number 919-816-4220. Attention: Event Operations, **but no later than 18 weeks before the closing date of entries for the show** (*Rules Applying to Dog Shows*, Chapter 4, Section 1). Be sure to give your Show Secretary and/ or Superintendent a copy and retain a copy for the club file
- **NOTE:** All approved judging panels will be published in the <u>Events Calendar</u> at least ONCE if the panel is received by the Event Operations Department at least five months prior to the show date. The publication of judging panels has proved very helpful to exhibitors who do not receive premium lists for an event. Also, publication of the panel in the <u>Events Calendar</u> will help your club realize the largest possible entry. To be published, a panel must be processed by the deadline for the publication of the particular issue.
