STARTING SCHOOL SEPTEMBER 2015

Parents of children starting school in September, will receive an offer of a place from 16th April (allow 2-3 working days for delivery). If you applied on-line you will receive an email. Do make sure you answer the letter to either accept that place or refuse it. The deadline for response forms is 7th May. Until you do this, your child's place will not be confirmed. If you applied late, the process for considering applications is 14th May, with offers being sent out 11th June.
