

A new year and a new chapter for us all. Shalom, As-Salaam Alaikum, Peace be with you,


#### Empty Bowls



#### FOCUS Advocates in 2016

Building on the successes and partnerships of last year, 2016 will be an exciting time of development and action for the FOCUS Advocates. I'm particularly excited about the unique roll our faith communities have in the work for justice. By seeking to end hunger, we tap into a universal human need, and can quickly identify all of the various systems and forces (some might say, powers and principalities) that keep people hungry, broken, and oppressed. Building relationships and standing in solidarity with marginalized people in our communities is something FOCUS does well, and is an essential ingredient in making social change.

In 2015, FOCUS continued its mission of hospitality, advocacy and justice, answering the call to be God's servant people in a broken world. With dedicated staff and volunteers, the FOCUS food programs responded to the needs in our community.

The Interfaith Food Pantry served an average of 292 households per month. The average number of guests at Breakfast Express (mid-April through October) was 51, and the average number of guests per morning at Winter Breakfast was 108. FOCUS promoted healthy, fresh food through the Gardening in a Bucket project and the Community Harvest Garden. In a related project, FOCUS and others collected school supplies which were distributed to students in the Albany schools.

Advocacy efforts were an integral part of FOCUS throughout the year as we spoke out and worked for long term solutions to hunger and poverty, often joining with other organizations and groups with similar interests and goals.

With the start of our new Advocacy Coordinator, Joe Paparone, the Hungry for Justice Project was merged with FOCUS Advocates and re-launched. The FOCUS Advocates are developing as a group dedicated to mobilizing congregations for organizing and advocacy. They are also involved in on-going anti-poverty and social justice campaigns.

During 2015, we worshiped together as a FOCUS community. The annual winter service was held at First Church Albany, where the good news was preached by the Rev. Dr. Paula Gravelle, Executive Director of the NYS Council of Churches. A hardy group gathered for the Easter sunrise service in West Capitol Park, which was followed by a community breakfast at Emmanuel Baptist Church. FOCUS members also joined together in worship the first Sunday of the sum-



mer months. A new development this year was a forum after each of these services. Topics were solitary confinement, minimum wage and the grocery collaborative.

Plans for the grocery collaborative (Friends and Neighbors Network or FANN) are progressing. The goal of the collaborative is to provide food security for low-income households in ways that maintain dignity, create relationships and develop skills through a jointly operated, hands-on, democratically controlled enterprise. The location is set for Union Missionary Baptist Church on Morton Avenue. Work is underway to secure a source for the food. In October, Nancy Yarnell of Food Security for America came to Albany to conduct a training and informational session for FOCUS staff and Board members.

Finally, 2015 has been a year of change. In the spring, Rev. Deb Jameson announced she would be stepping down as Director of FOCUS at the end of the year. For 16 years. we have been greatly blessed by her ministry, vision and presence among us. FOCUS and the wider community had the opportunity to wish Rev. Deb Godspeed at an event in December.

It has been a privilege to serve as President and to work with so many faithful staff and volunteers. In particular I would like to thank Allan Tedrow of Westminster Presbyterian Church who has served on the FOCUS Executive Council for many years, filling the role of Financial Secretary and Vice-President. We wish Allan well as he retires from this position.

In January 2016 FOCUS welcomed Rev. Jim Ketcham as the new Executive Director of the FOCUS churches. As we go forward together in 2016, seeking to balance charity and justice, your support, participation and prayers are most welcome.

The FOCUS Executive Council approved a 2016 budget of pledged and anticipated income totaling \$317,214.

The budget supports all facets of FOCUS programming and relies on many sources of income.

Pledges from FOCUS Covenant Churches, totaling \$63,035, will continue to support the Executive staff, outreach, project activities, and administration. Other income for these uses will come from fundraising, grants and other contributions. They are projected to provide an additional **\$84,000**, with a total for the core budget of \$147,035.


FOCUS feeding programs, the Interfaith Food Pantry, Winter Breakfast, and Breakfast Express are supported by affiliate faith communities, donations from FOCUS churches, individuals, groups, grants, and a direct service contract with NYS Department of Health, Hunger Prevention and Nutrition Assistance funding. Feeding program budgets total \$170,179.
