*Submission of a current-year Commonwealth of VA School Entrance Health Form is mandatory:

- Each page must be completed in its entirety accompanied with physician's signature and corresponding date.
- Immunization record and annual physical examination must be included for: PK3, PK4, K5 and ALL FIRST TIME STUDENTS TO READY ACADEMY.
- > READY Academy reserves the right to request additional information at any time and can postpone enrollment/attendance until all information deemed necessary has been submitted, accordingly.
- > If a condition and/or section does not pertain to the student child, <u>PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE SECTION BLANK</u>. These sections can be marked <u>"N/A"</u> indicating Not Applicable. This confirms to staff that the student is not impacted by the information requested as well as the parent/guardian has reviewed the information in question.

Book Review Format for 4th Grade

The student will write a summary of the book they read. The summary should be dated with the title of the book centered. First paragraph: Tell about the main points in the book, main characters and the problem in the story. Second paragraph: How was the problem solved and how would you have solved the problem? The third paragraph: What was your favorite part of the book and why? The report must be in a cover; with a cover sheet including the name, book, title, author and date. If hand-written, it should be done neatly in cursive. You may opt to type your report. All reports should be placed in a folder.

Extra points will be given for a typed paper.
