- 1. The sections which apply to Discharge Books are in the Merchant Shipping (Seaman's Documents) Regulations 1987.
- 2. You will need to provide satisfactory evidence of your current or intended employment in a ship registered in the Isle of Man.

A certificate or statement from the Master or your employer on an official form or headed paper is generally all that is required.

If you are a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies and if you have been discharged abroad and intend to take a job as a seafarer when you return to the Isle of Man you should apply within six months of your discharge.

- 3. You do not need a Discharge Book (though you may still apply and your application will be considered).
- a) If you are working in a ship just on construction, alteration, repair or testing on the ship, its machinery or equipment and have nothing to do with navigating the ship;

Or

b) If you are working in a ship just providing goods, personal services, entertaining on board and are employed by a person who is not the Master or owner nor a member of the catering staff in the ship;

- c) If you are a member of the navy, army or air force of the Crown or any service administered by the Defence Council whilst acting on their behalf;
- 4. Do NOT apply for a Discharge Book
- a) If you already have one which has been issued under the Merchant Shipping (Seaman's Documents) Regulations 1987;

OR

b) If you are employed by the Crown and are not normally working as a master or a seafarer;

OR

c) If you are employed in a fishing vessel;

OR

d) If you have a document with almost the same information as a Discharge Book which has been issued to you by the Government or a representative of any country listed in Note 13a.

British Seaman's Card Notes

- 5. The sections which apply to British Seaman's Cards are in the Merchant Shipping (Seaman's Documents) Regulations 1987.
- 6. Generally, if you are a British seafarer employed in a ship registered in any country and have a right of abode in the Isle of Man you may apply for a British Seaman's Card.

A British seaman is one who is not an alien as explained in the British Nationality Act 1981 and whose normal job is master or seaman.

- 7. Do NOT apply
- a) If you are working in a fishing vessel;

OR

b) If you work in a ship belonging to a general lighthouse authority;

OR

c) If you receive little or no wages (but DO apply if you are a cadet);

OR

d) If you are not a citizen of the United Kingdom or Colonies OR a British protected person working in a ship registered outside the United Kingdom, the Channel Isles, the Isle of Man or any colony, protectorate, protected state or associated state:

OR

- e) If you hold a valid seaman's identity document issued by the Government or representative of any country listed in 13(b).
- 8. DO apply if you are
- a) A citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies;

OR

b) A British protected person;

OR

c) A British subject without citizenship;

OR

- d) A British subject by virtue of Section 31 of the British Nationality Act 1981.
- 9. You may apply and your application will be considered if you do NOT have a right of abode but can provide evidence proving you are a British subject such as a valid United Kingdom and Colonial passport or a Commonwealth passport.

General Notes

10. Counter signatory

Part D is to be filled in by a Member of Parliament, a Justice of the Peace, minister of religion, medical or legal practitioner, established civil servant, bank official, public official, police officer, head or senior official of a shipping company, union official or any other person of a similar standing who has known you personally for at least two (2) years.

- (A member of your family should NOT complete the certificate)
- 11. Photographs
- a) If you are applying for either a Discharge Book or a British Seaman's Card you will need

to supply two identical recent photographs of yourself. If applying for both documents 3 photographs should be sent.

- b) The photographs should be taken full face without a hat and should be printed on normal photographic paper, unmounted.
- c) The photographs should be of clear exposure. Photographs which are too light or dark will not be accepted.
- d) The backs of the photographs are not to be glazed. If colour photographs are supplied they must be 'passport approved'.
- e) Unless you are sending a valid passport (endorsed to show that you have a right of abode) with your application, the person who countersigns your application should also endorse the back of one of your photographs with the words:

I CERTIFY THAT THIS IS A TRUE LIKENESS OF

MR/MRS/MISS/MS or TITLE..... and add his/her signature.
