LEAP YEAR



Every four years in the Gregorian calendar, an extra day is added to the calendar in order to synchronize it with the solar year.

This occurs in every year that is divisible by four and only in century years that are evenly divided by 400.

- Ex. 800, 1200, 2000 were leap years...BUT 1700 and 1900 were not because they are not divisible by 400, even though they are divisible by four.

In a leap year, the extra day is added at the end of February, giving it 29 days instead of 28.

The extra day is called a leap day, or an intercalary day.

It takes the earth a little bit less than $365 \frac{1}{4}$ days (365.242 days) to orbit the Sun (solar year). For this reason, the full day is only added once every four years. In the Julian calendar, there is still an 11-minute, 14-second discrepancy each year.

46 B.C. - The practice of adding the extra day began with the creation of the Julian calendar and a decree by Julius Caesar. The Julian calendar simply created an extra day every four years, and did not follow the century-divisible-by-400 rule.

1582 A.D. - The 11-minute discrepancy in the Julian calendar adds up to ten days by this point. Pope Gregory XIII creates the Gregorian calendar and drops ten days from the month of October. He also establishes February 29th as the official date to add during a leap year, coined the term leap year, and created the rules for adding the leap year.

Currently the solar year is approximately 26 seconds shorter than the Gregorian year.

Within a century, the fourth year is the first leap year.

In the U.S., leap year coincides with presidential election years.

2015 YEAR END FINANCIAL UPDATE

Although we entered December 2015 being \$30,000 behind our budget in Unified Receipts, we ended receiving a total of \$74,259 in Unified and Adopt a Bill receipts during the month of December, which put us \$3,618 ahead of our 2015 budgeted amount. Thanks to all for sharing God's treasures. Combined with total receipts over budget and expenses down, all bills were paid and we started a new year with a cash reserve balance.

During 2016 we will need \$10,330.90 each week to meet our budget.

RUBY'S PANTRY

We are extremely excited about starting the Ruby's Pantry program at Redeemer at the end of January. We are given the opportunity to not only provide some much needed assistance to the community, but also to spread the word of God to our friends and neighbors.

We are going to be able to provide a large amount of food (50-100 pounds) for a donation of only \$20.

We are expecting 300-400 people that we can help out in just one evening.

Ruby's Pantry is a Faith-Based Program!

Ruby's Pantry is free for everyone! Ruby's Pantry is a "hand up, not a handout"

Ruby's Pantry is not government funded! The food distribution is funded almost entirely by the donations of the participating families.

When and Where is this being held? The Ruby's Pantry distribution in Green Bay is on the 4th Monday of each month at **Redeemer Lutheran Church, 210 S. Oneida St.** Registration starts at Redeemer School at 4:00 PM with the Food Distribution from 4:30 – 6:00 PM.

What do I expect to receive? You will receive an abundance of nutritious food from Ruby's Pantry. How much depends upon what comes in the week of the distribution.

The value of the food is usually between \$50 and \$150, for a \$20 donation.

All of the food provided is from major food manufacturers and distributors.

What do I need to bring?

Please bring \$20 cash per portion and Two (2) large boxes, laundry baskets or storage bins per order.

The Registration requirement is just your name, address, phone number, email address (if you have one) and the number of people in your household, once per calendar year. Nothing else needs to be shown. And, after your food portion is filled, you will receive assistance in getting the food to your vehicle!

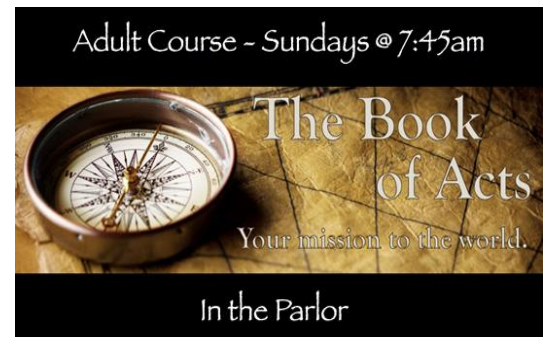

SUPER SALE – WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

The Super Sale for this year is set for the week-end of Aug. 12-14th. Please mark your calendar so you will be available to help and to shop. Begin cleaning cupboards and drawers now while the weather is cold and snowy. Please check in at the office before leaving anything in the basement storage area. If possible, store your donations at home and deliver them to the gym before the sale. (Times will be announced in July).

1. Pack your donations in boxes with covers or with flaps so boxes may be stacked for more efficient storage. If you have extra boxes with covers and/or flaps, please deliver them to the basement so we can replace any bad boxes.
2. Pack your donations well, wrapping anything fragile to protect it from breakage.
3. The basement is being monitored for efficient and safe storage, so please leave your boxes where they will not be in the way and don't make them too heavy so they can't be moved.
4. If you use a cart to deliver to the basement, please unload it immediately. Carts are used for many things during the year and must never be left filled.
5. Don't donate items with stains or holes or anything that is not clean or is not in good working order. If you would not buy it, please do not donate it.
6. PLEASE DO NOT donate the following items. If they do not sell, it is difficult for us to re-donate them and we must, at our expense, find a place that will accept them or pay to dispose of them.
 1. Clothing, including shoes, boots, belts, scarves, mittens/gloves or hats.
 2. Personal items that have already been opened – creams, shampoo, lotions etc.
 3. Mattresses, box springs or sofa beds – We WILL accept bedroom furniture, frames, dressers, head and foot boards.
 4. Cribs and crib mattress, children's car seats and booster chairs.
 5. Exercise equipment or skis
 6. Entertainment centers and furniture made of particle board
 7. Old electronics: TV's that are not flat panel, phones, monitors, etc.
 8. Reference type books, textbooks, self-help books, encyclopedias, non-fiction books and magazines. We WILL accept fiction, children's books and cookbooks.
 9. 8-track tapes and VHS tapes

We are also asking for zip-lock type baggies of all sizes. These can be left in the box in the 2nd floor coat room area marked for this donation.

SCRIP PROGRAM AT OUR SAVIOUR

Why do we have one?

Maybe you have asked yourself ‘What the heck is SCRIP, anyway?’ Or ‘Why do you keep asking me to buy SCRIP?’ Well, in a nutshell, SCRIP is ‘substitute money’. What you would recognize as gift cards that you can buy in and for many stores is sold to you at Our Saviour for cash and then used by you THE SAME AS cash at the selected store.

Our Saviour, as a non-profit entity, is given the opportunity to purchase gift cards at a discount of up to 23%, depending on the company. We, in turn, sell the cards for full price. The amount between the cost and the full price becomes the profit made by Our Saviour.

What is your favorite grocery store? Where do you buy gas? When you go out to eat, what restaurant do you visit? Check out the list of ‘on hand’ SCRIP at the Welcome Center. Most of our local gas stations on are on the list (Grand Central Station cards are valid at any Shell station in the country), almost ALL of our grocery stores and a wide variety of fast-food and casual restaurants are on the list.

Besides those we have available to sell immediately, there are also that can be ordered. A list of them is in the 3-ring binder at the Welcome Center. These cards would be ordered on Sunday and would be ready for pick up the next Sunday (or in the office usually by Thursday).

Are you planning a trip? SCRIP for your hotel or airline may be available for purchase. Is a do-it-yourself home improvement in your future? Order Menard’s, Home Depot or Fleet Farm in higher quantities to make those large purchases.
