AUGUST PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOP

The August programs and workshop will be presented by Sandi Irish from the Twin Cities area of Minnesota. She comes recommend to us by her friend and ours, Jan Malone. Sandi has been guilting for more than 16 years, and for the past 7-teaching, designing quilts, and doing other commissioned works. Sandi says, "I consider myself very blessed to have the opportunity to have a career where I can "take pleasure in all my toil" (Ecclesiastes 3:13), to be able to teach others and to share the talents God has given me." Sandi will be presenting a trunk show, some artsy ones and some of her own patterns with several variations. Mitered borders and machine trapunto are a couple of the highlights. She will also have FQ bundles and fabrics (at reasonable prices), as well as patterns.

The workshop is a half day "show pin quilt" project. It's an advanced beginner quilt, good for working on an exact 1/4" seam and matching points. The pattern was designed for displaying pins, of any kind. Personally, I think it's the perfect wall quilt for the kids or grand kids. More information and the supply list is on the COQG website. 





Templates for "Sarah's Choice" as 12.00 by 12.00 (inches) block, printed from EQ6!



Cut 3 ½ 'squares

Cut 17 ½ 'square of background Slice diagonally twice These are your 4 C's

Use the template, or cut 3 7/8"
Squares of 2 prints. Layer the 2
Prints together and draw a
diagonal line. Sew a scant ‡" seam
On either side and cut apart.
These are you half sq triangles.

Block of the Month: First Lady Blocks

Sarah Polk (1803-1891) First Lady 1845-1849

Sarah's in-laws felt that she showed more of a mind of her own "than was fitting in one woman." Education was important to Sarah's family and she was tutored at home, then rode 200 miles on horseback to the Salem Female Academy in North Carolina, the premier girls' school of the time. While there, she studied the usual academic subjects and the usual wifely skills of needlepoint, piano, and managing the home.

Once married, Sarah chose spending time with her husband over domestic chores. Her hostess skills were very important to James as his career advanced. She loved to travel with him, but could not openly campaign, so was often left at home while he was electioneering. Sarah promoted harmony while trying to get Democrats elected.

Sarah had friendships with other strong-minded women, even those whose husbands were Whigs. She had gas lights installed in the White House, but, luckily, kept the earlier chandeliers, just in case.

George Dallas, the VP elect, said of her, "she is certainly the mistress of herself and, I suspect, of someone else also."

Quilting Tip

Thanks, again, to Darby Hollister, COQG member, for this month's tip. Ever notice how when you're through with a project and have thread left on the bobbin, it never stays wound? Use the smallest pony tail scrunchie available and put it around the bobbin for no more tangled mess. Best of all, it is CHEAP! This also works for spools of thread. Just put the pony tail scrunchie on the spool and pull it over the thread end. (I got mine at Wal-Mart, 48 on a card.)
