Through Personal Development, Tutor time and one to one support. Students will be expected to write draft Personal statements. They will be supported by their tutor in Year 12 and then will be assigned a referee in Year 13. All Sixth Form tutors are actively involved in the UCAS process. Students will be given a Personal Statement pack to guide them through this difficult yet important task. It is vital that students write lots of draft personal statements and not leave this to the last minute. Many Universities don't interview and the personal statement is the one thing that will give your daughter/son the chance to tell the universities why they are applying, and why they should want them! We really ask for parent support during this arduous process. Their final copy must be handed in after the summer holidays.
