As we reach the end of the term I would like to thank you for another fantastic year at Clober Primary School. There have been many events this term, which I have listed below. Nursery Updates – appointments and next term!

The nursery has undergone a tremendous amount of change throughout the year. Since the rebuild in August 2015 we have welcomed many new learners and staff.

I am delighted to inform you that I am now recruiting all permanent staff to the nursery and this process is well underway. The staffing for next year will be quite different as we will introduce the new extended day and extended year provision. Clober Nursery will open from 8am to 6pm over a 50 week year starting from Monday 17th August 2015!

I have recently appointed the new Depute Head of Centre post. Mrs Kirsty Mahindru was the successful candidate who joins us from Canniesburn Nursery. This is an excellent appointment for Clober. Mrs Law will continue to be involved in the management of the nursery in order to continue a smooth transition during this time of change.

On Monday 15th June I will appoint two new Senior Early Years Workers and I will inform you of who has been successful in due course. Interviews for the remaining Early Years Workers will be carried out by Friday 19th June and we will then inform you of the new appointments for these posts in August 2015!

Can I thank all parents for their continued support during this time of change. I am hoping that <u>all</u> vacancies will be appointed permanently as we start the new session. This should allow us to implement the extended day and year provision with ease.

Goodbye Mr Young! Leaving Ceremony for our Janitor



Friday 28th May was a very sad day as we said goodbye to our favourite Janitor Mr Young, after 10 very successful years at Clober. Electives at Clober

Each term pupils from P4 to P7 are involved in developing their own personal choice programme of study. Some of these 'electives' have included Netball, Chess, Football, Jewellery Making, iPads and PC work, fitness and cookery classes. This allows our pupils to select different areas of interest each term to develop their skills in particular areas. We hope this then fosters a natural interest in some of the activities and sports and that they may take these up within the local community or when they go to secondary school. Growing Up Project for Nursery and P1 Pupils

This will be the third year that this extremely successful Primary 1 and Nursery transition project has taken place. The aim of the project is to promote learning across the Early Level of Curriculum for Excellence and enhance learners' wellbeing. All P1 and nursery children take part in small group activities related to the environment, science or health. Within the groups there is a mixture of P1 pupils and Nursery boys and girls. This has been a real success again this year and each child has received a certificate for their efforts!

Music Instruction – Choir, Percussion, Cello, Clarinet, Violin and Chalameau!

As you are aware we have offered Cello and Violin for a number of years. In the last few years I have been introducing more percussion based music making as well as woodwind. Primary 4 and Primary 5 have intensive music percussion classes before they are introduced to the Chalameau. This instrument is like a mini clarinet and those who enjoy playing it can progress to an 'actual' clarinet when their skills have developed. We now have an extremely successful school orchestra which grows from strength to strength each year. The Primary 3 and Primary 5 to Primary 7 Choirs continue to grow also. <u> Hopscotch Theatre - What A Lot of Rubbish! Eco theme</u>

As part of our year round Eco and Health activities Hopscotch Theatre made a visit to the school to promote recycling at home and in school. In advance they had to learn a song about REDUCE, REUSE and RECYCLE — I am sure some pupils will have been singing it at home! The drama was very well received by pupils and staff.

Sporting Endeavours – Hockey, Rugby, Football, Netball and Athletics Visits

Each term I report on the successes of our Sporting groups who attend many activities throughout the year to take part in tournaments for Netball, Football, Rugby, Hockey and Athletics. All children who attend these events perform extremely well in their sports but more importantly they





are superb ambassadors for Clober. Their politeness and sportsmanship qualities are often remarked upon – very well done to all.
